The twins Wanda and Rhonda opened the evening. Wanda Stevens welcomed all the ladies and Rhonda blessed the food.



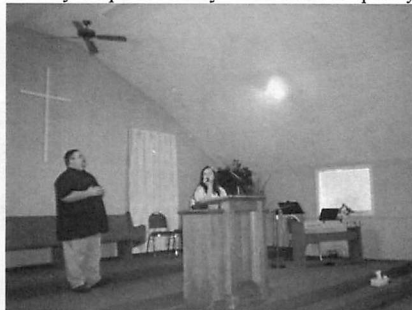

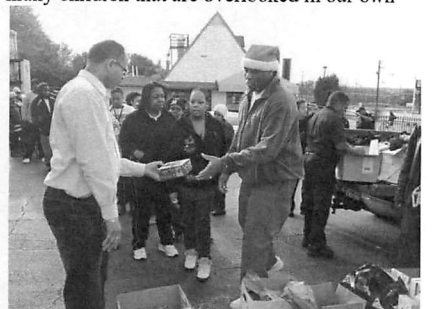

Christmas is a time to celebrate the birth of Christ's birthday and a present to him would be to give to someone less fortunate. There are so many children that are overlooked in our own

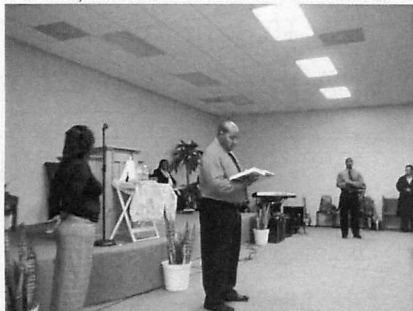

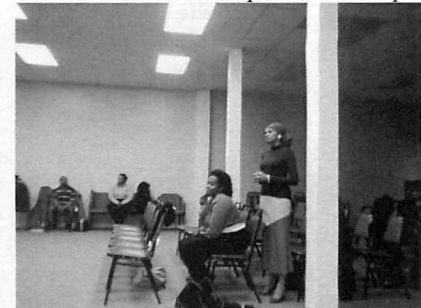

After the praise and worship music, it was testimony time. First was a woman identified as Felicia who testified that she went to the jail even though her children were not there. She

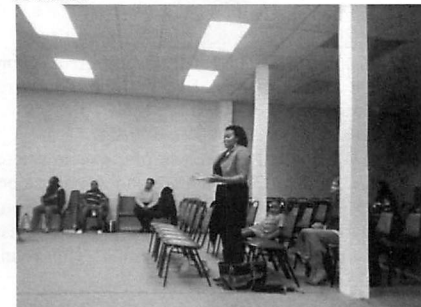
said, "Sometimes it takes someone else to witness to your child."

Pastor Carol Patmon stepped up to the podium and introduced Bishop Kevin Magness.

Bishop Magness began and moved quickly to high gear. He began in John 2:1, the wedding feast.

"Lord, let all of me die and all of you live. You have kept the good wine until now." He turned to the congregation. "Water is very important – the birth. Unless you are born of water, you cannot receive the new wine.

"There's a world out there that has gotten high on wine and lots of other stuff. Do you think they are gonna come to any church that is not going to show them how to get higher than those drugs they been taking? They don't know it but they are looking for a dose of the Holy Ghost.

"God is gonna send a revival to the area like there has never been. This is not just a Pentecostal thing. It never has been. A man and woman walked up to me at a revival and asked for 'some of that Holy Ghost stuff' I had been talking about. They got it. I found out they were the pastor of a Methodist Church and his wife. This is not just a Pentecostal thing. It's a Jesus, Holy Ghost thing.

"Two very proper old ladies came up to me and told me that their father wanted to meet me. I thought, "Y'all are older than Methuselah – your father?" They received the baptism in the Holy Ghost and I found out they were nuns from the Catholic school up the road."

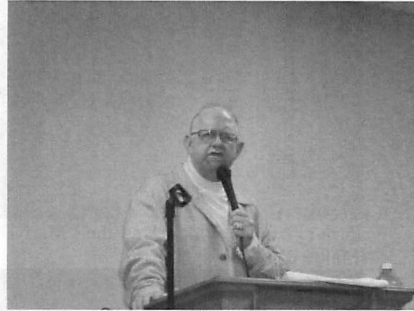
The Bishop walked around the pulpit to a table in front of it with a container of grapes and a bottle of sparkling grape juice. "The process: new wine making. One grape cannot become wine. It takes the whole bunch - us. The grapes must go through many things to become wine.

The grapes will attract an airborne fungus that will try to attach to their skin and cause them to be unusable. Demons will attempt to do the same to you if you are about to be used by God.

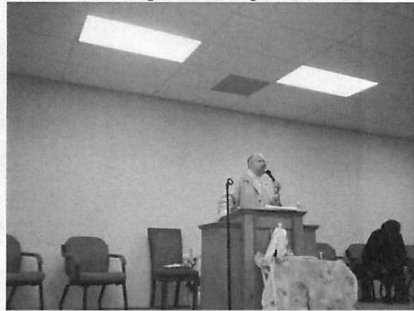
"Before the grape juice can become wine it must be separated. Until the grape is away from its life support, it will never become wine. You will never become the new wine until you are separated from the world system. (Come out from among them and be ye separate). Every grape is a little different but they all come together to make the wine.

"The grapes must be crushed and it is best to crush them closest to their home (Mic 7:6). You

may think you don't deserve this or that you will never make it through but I remind you that Romans 8:28 shows us that God will make your water into wine."

"Every so often the skim must be removed to keep the wine from becoming sour. I'd rather be with an unrepentant sinner than some old sour church person. The temperature must be high enough or there is no fermentation. Then the storage container (for instance the bottle) must be topped off – it must be absolutely full to avoid space for bacteria to grow. You must be filled and stay full, then stored in a dark cellar. Weeping may endure for a night but joy is gonna come in the morning."

There are 90 believers who worship at Miracle Deliverance. Church leaders include The Rev. Roger Williams, Deacon Marco Scott, Martin Porter and Vet Driskell (the daughter of the Pastors Patmon).

There is a children's program at the church and childcare is available during services, which is taken care of by Ms. Felicia Bowen.

The church gave away over 375 toys, books, and games on Saturday 24 December 2011 to families in need.

On Thursday 24 November 2011 Miracle Deliverance held a community Thanksgiving dinner. To-go plates were delivered to many sick and shut-in people in the community. The food pantry was also open for anyone who needed additional assistance.

Pam related some stories about people who faced death or major changes at Christmas time. "There was the 16 year-old son who was in a near fatal accident. It was very bad and he was



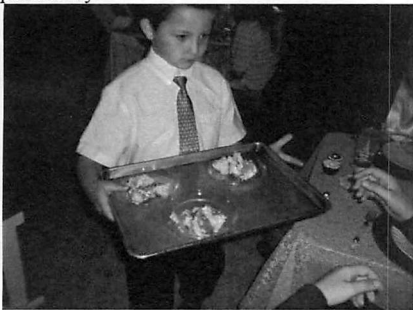
life-flighted to Grady. This changed his whole perspective about life that Christmas season.

That got our attention and we went back to church. We went to Church of God of Prophecy Winder and grew there. We learned that ministry was the way to go. We had a singing ministry and I pursued my license in the Congregational Holiness Church and prayed about pastoring.

“My dad was the pastor of this church but he got sick and on October 16<sup>th</sup> the presbytery appointed me pastor when my dad resigned.

“Everybody here is like a family. The building started out as a dance hall in the early 1960s and became The Light House Church in 1977. It was a very large congregation years ago but has died away some over the years.

“There is a nursery but people can bring their children into the sanctuary if they wish. It is a family oriented church with a heart to serve the community.”

The business began in 1988 and was mostly yard work but in 1994 they dropped the yard work and went full time.

With Christian music playing in the background, Joe explained, “The grace of God has kept us in work. Without God in it, we wouldn’t want to be in it. He has blessed us with work when others were looking for work. He has always provided. When the money was down, a special job would come up to help us get by.”

“We have cleaned many different kindsof places: The Boys and Girls Club, churches, restaurants, offices, grocery stores, warehouses, even carpets in residences. We still have customers that we had in the very beginning. We always clean as if we were cleaning our Father’s house. If we have to do **more**, we don’t worry about the money. We want it to be done so that it would be acceptable to the Lord.

“Sometimes we get emergency calls. Only a couple of months ago a lady ran water in her

bath tub and it overflowed onto the floor, through the floor and into the down stairs. She treated us like ministering angels when we showed up as quickly as we did and did our job.”



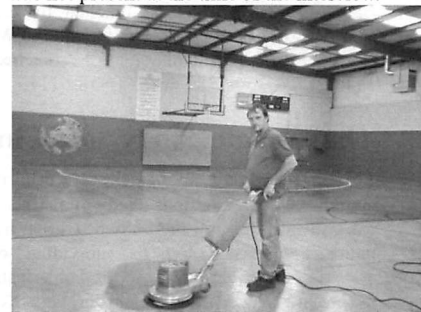

“We get so much more back from it when we do it as for the Lord – not more money but more satisfaction. Well, it probably brings us more work too. It may sound kind of jingly but we have a motto: We clean with care for a price that’s fair.”

We asked Joe if there were any particularly interesting stories about cleaning jobs they had done, not expecting the answer we got.

Joe thought for only a second and named the name of a grocery store in Dahlonga. They all looked at each other and their eyes became larger.

"I don't know how well this will fit in a Christian newspaper. All I know is what we saw and experienced."

Joe related several stories colored by comments from Ashley and Wanda. The following is one of those stories as it was begun by Ashley.

"We were in the front part of the store and we saw a man staring at us through the window. He was dressed in old timey clothes with a tall top hat. At the same time, Chris was outside and saw the same man from the rear, as though he was inside the glass."

Joe took over the story from there, "I came in to clean the store alone and I found a shopping buggy with tools in it. I knew that the heating and air man used a buggy to put his tools in. So I called the owner and asked him if the man forgot his tools. He told me that the man was there earlier and called him terrified. The heating and air man said he would never go into that store again, not even to get his tools. It seems he was there alone and heard someone enter the store. He called out to let them know he was there. He heard someone approaching but got no answer. When he looked he saw a man dressed as one would dress in the 19<sup>th</sup> century with a tall top hat. He hailed the man a second time to tell him the store was closed and watched the man walk completely through the meat cooler as if it were not there. The maintenance man ran out of the store, leaving his tools never to return."

## Bank of Faith

In Phillipians 4:19, Apostle Paul adds what is the best known and best loved verse in this chapter. Please notice the promise follows people's faithful stewardship or discipleship with God. Just sitting back believing God will still supply their needs is not how things work with God. While it is true that God will supply the needs of his people, this is only if they are

faithful to him, devoted to his work and to their giving. Think of Phil 4:19 as a note drawn by a bank. At the Bank of Faith, the words, "My God" mean he is the banker; "shall supply" is the promise to pay; "all your need" is the value of the note; "according to his riches" is the bank capital; "in glory" is the address of the bank; and "by Christ Jesus" is the signature at the foot, without which, the note is worthless.

We place our money in earthly banks. I say it is time to save at the Bank of Faith. We have God's bank note (promise) to supply all our needs if we trust him and remain loyally faithful. I don't know about anyone else, but I want to store important treasures in the Bank of Faith. I'm here to shout it out: YOU CAN'T TAKE WHAT YOU HAVE STORED IN THE WORLD WITH YOU TO HEAVEN! Get your mind and heart right with the Lord before it's too late, and invest in the Bank of Faith.

### Access Denied (from pg 9)

LORD said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do. Come, let us go down, and confound their language, that they may not understand one another's speech. So the LORD scattered them abroad from thence upon the face of all the earth: and they left off to build the city. You can read this in the eleventh chapter of the book of Genesis.

This story is known to us as the "Tower of Babel," and it is one of the most fascinating passages found in the Holy Bible. I believe, that it is a very important one, and key to more than one mystery. The people spoken of are mere mortals: sons and daughters of Adam and Eve. The text clearly states, "the people is one." The word used here means united. They were completely in agreement. They were saying the same thing and they were doing the same thing. These were not people who were trying to please Almighty God; and yet, their wholehearted agreement with one another resulted in great power and ability. I suggest you stop right here and spend some time considering what we have just discovered.

-----CONSIDER-----

The power of agreement is not limited to Christian people. It is a law written into the universe by the Great Creator. Great and mighty things are possible, when people come into agreement, regardless of who these people are. In our "Tower of Babel" story, the Almighty makes a profound statement, concerning what they are attempting to do, and these are his words: "Behold the people is one, and they all have one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do."

Did you catch that?! He clearly implies that these people are going to be able to do, what would otherwise be impossible. Did the Almighty mean that they could actually build a tower all the way to heaven? He used the words "nothing will be restrained." Nothing! It is obvious from this story, that these people would be able to accomplish something great, that was completely against His will. Almighty God refused access. He did not permit them to enter

this realm of possibility, and put an end to their venture by confounding their language. Can you imagine how planet-changing the Tower of Babel people's efforts were apparently going to be? I think it is completely fascinating the length to which Almighty God went to terminate their efforts. Their efforts were such a threat to all the Almighty intended, that he once again transcended time and space to intervene. He disrupted their communications beyond repair. It is very difficult to work together as one, without the ability to communicate. Because they were not able to continue the work, they were dispersed abroad.

What would have happened, had not the Almighty interfered? No one knows for sure, but you can be sure of this: the world would have gone in a much different direction. Would they have somehow transcended the natural world and entered the spirit world? Possibly yes, because their goal was to build a tower that reached to heaven. We have now built pyramids and sky scrapers that reach far into the sky, so the Almighty was plainly not concerned about them building a very high tower. We have built space ships, with which we have orbited the earth, and landed on the moon. We have sent our probes deep into space past planets, and this indicates, that the creator was not worried about them going into space. The Almighty has allowed mankind to split the atom, making nuclear energy. He has allowed marvelous medical breakthroughs that have virtually eradicated numerous diseases. We have the ability to travel to anywhere on the globe in a matter of hours. We enjoy amazing telecommunications that allow us to talk to someone half way around the world, or do banking from inside our homes. With the making of computers, we have billions of pieces of knowledge information at our fingertips, and this available to individuals in their home via the internet. The Almighty does not seem too concerned with what we accomplish in the physical realm, but it seems obvious, that these people were about to go beyond the natural, and tread into the spirit realm in such a way, that would somehow disrupt Almighty God's design. I think very possibly their efforts would have accomplished an alliance with fallen angels. These wicked creatures certainly are opposed to all that is right and good, and nothing would have pleased them more, than to disrupt the Almighty's plans.

We can see clearly here, that unity amongst humans is a great power. This power was made by the Great Creator, for all things were created by Him and for Him. The power of unity is so great, that if it is misused as at the Tower of Babel, the Almighty moves swiftly and decisively before it gets out of hand. Can you imagine the potential? It is mind-boggling. I cannot overstate this power, and you will likely miss the thrust of this book, if you miss this point. The power of individuals is consolidated by unity and multiplied exponentially. A person that goes it alone can certainly have singleness of mind and thus accomplish quite a lot; however, unity can multiply productivity greatly. This is a simple yet profound concept, that has virtually been ignored.

In Genesis chapter 11, and verse 4, we find this phrase, "let us make us a name." This appears to be a part of the problem. Here is fallen man searching for a way to lift himself up. Instead of turning to the Almighty, they were looking to

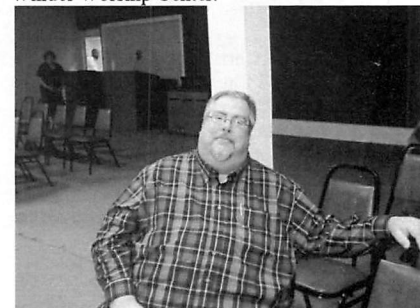
themselves. This word name also includes the idea of "memorial of individuality," the idea of honor, the idea of authority, the idea of fame. This was their mindset, and they go on to use the phrase "lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth." This was in rebellion to the Almighty's directive in Genesis chapter 9, and verse one, replenish or fill the earth.

There is another aspect here that could bear scrutiny. The Holy Bible teaches us, that Satan rebelled against Almighty God. There was war in heaven between Michael the archangel, and Satan. Michael prevailed, because Almighty God commissioned him to expel Satan from heaven. Satan, and one third of the angels, being conspirators with him, were defeated and removed from heaven permanently. He was cast out of heaven, and down to earth. Satan goes to and fro, and up and down in the earth, as a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. He only comes to steal, kill, and destroy. Having started his mutiny in heaven against the Most High, he continued this rebellion in the Garden of Eden, and we see more of his rebellious efforts in the people of the Tower of Babel. But there was a time much earlier, when Satan was greater, and he played a different role in the affairs of the universe.

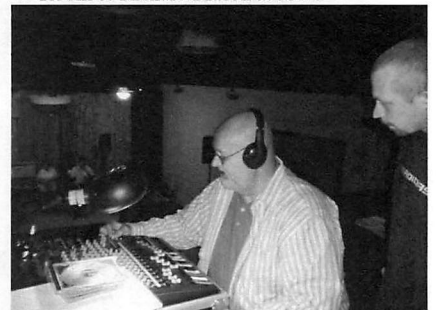

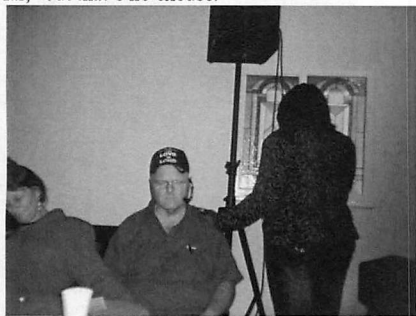

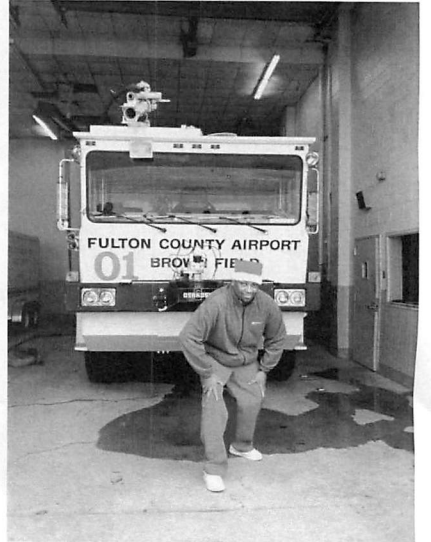

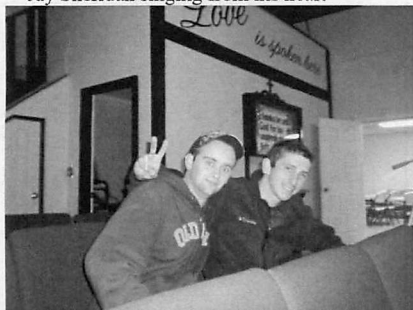

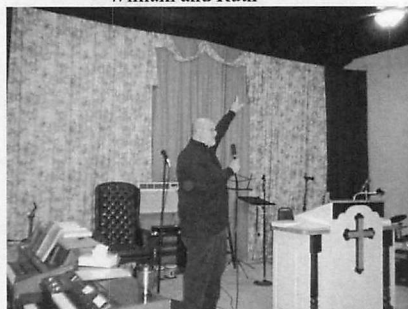
