of persecution, including martyrdom. This is the type of environment where you will find the concept of denomination much diminished, and the concept of unity of significantly greater importance in Christ's church. Once again, I plead with you to read all of this with an open heart concerning Almighty God and his kingdom. As a fellow believer, you want to please the Great Creator more than you want to please any man, or organization. Please, let us learn to align ourselves with Christ and his kingdom, and let us learn to decrease the influence in our lives of anything that would cause unnecessary division amongst us brethren. You quite possibly already agree with some of the things in this book, and you will probably struggle with other things I have written in here. Please read the whole book before passing judgment upon it. How can a person make an objective critique of something they only have partial knowledge of? Thank you, and may Almighty God bless you as you align yourself more correctly with Him and his people. Now let us continue the thoughts we were considering.

The day of Pentecost is quite intriguing, for it seems to undo some of the consequences of the Tower of Babel. Acts 2:1, "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all in one accord in one place." Once again we find people getting into agreement, but this time these one hundred and twenty souls are in agreement in a way that is pleasing to the Almighty. They have spent ten days together, diligently asking the Almighty to send the Comforter, and they are all gathered in one place. On the tenth day, there came a sound like a rushing mighty wind, or a driving violent wind, and it filled the whole house. This sound was from heaven. Imagine how powerful this event was, for these words are descriptive of great power. Have you ever had a wind blowing around you or your home with such violence that it seemed everything could blow away any minute? This was a very powerful event that left quite an impression on the 120, who were assembled there. What apparently was separated tongues of fire, appeared in the room and sat upon each person. The Holy Spirit filled each and every one of them, and they began to speak with different languages. What is really interesting here is that there were at least sixteen different language groups of people present in Jerusalem on that day, and they all understood what the 120 were

As the 120 continued speaking the works of Almighty God, in languages they had never learned, they began to leave the upper room where they had been gathered, and continued in this fashion before the thousands in Jerusalem. As the news spread quickly concerning the strange phenomena, the multitude of people came together, and were in somewhat of an uproar, being perplexed. They did not understand what was happening, but they did understand the words the 120 were speaking; and this in spite of the fact that the multitude was made up of people from many nations, having different languages. The multitude was astonished, looking on in wonder and admiration. No one had ever witnessed such an event, neither had they heard of anything like it. They realized that the 120 were all of the same language; and yet, they were communicating perfectly to at least sixteen different language groups. Apparently all the people, from at least 16 different nations, were also experiencing a miraculous hearing with their ears transcended the language barrier.

Think about it. At the Tower of Babel the people were of one accord, on a mission that displeased Almighty God, and as a result, had their languages confounded. On the day of Pentecost, the people were of one accord, on a mission that pleased the Almighty, and the language barrier was broken, as if it did not even exist. It was as if the sixteen or so languages suddenly became one language. In a city with such international diversity, this event was profoundly unique. The people in Jerusalem knew they were experiencing a very strange and unusual phenomena. Whereas, the event at the Tower of Babel forced them to disperse; the event on the day of Pentecost brought them together. The result that day was three thousand converts to Christ, and apparently the converts were from 16 different nationalities. Can you imagine? What an astounding accomplishment this was in what had, only (Cont. on pg. 10)

I learned that some families lie in order for their children to attend school, and that some families with children have to stay hidden or be separated.

Jesus said, "The people need a place to live where they can learn what I teach while staying together as a family. The name "Christian House" suddenly came to me. Christian House would be a place where people live in a godly environment while they get help straightening out their lives. It should be a shining light of hope to people in need. We should be able to show homeless people that someone cares, and that life is worth living for Jesus. We at Christian House would help people find work and transport them there and back until they could do it themselves. While living at Christian House, people could be part of an in-house staff program, which could help provide work skills if needed and help people feel connected to the Christian House ministry through involvement in running it. People don't have to be homeless. For those who have work but have lost their homes, there would also be a place at Christian House.

I can sympathize with people in situations like this because my wife, son, and I lived on my wife's monthly income of \$684.00 for almost two years. This is all we had to pay for rent, utilities, food, car insurance and gas. We were blessed that our landlord was a Christian. He could have had us evicted, but he allowed us to pay \$100.00 per month until our situation stabilized.

After the Lord blessed us, we helped an 18-year-old turn his life around by allowing him to stay with us. My wife and I helped him get his driver's license and his GED. The young man is now 20, has his own car, a job, and is in church. He shared with us that he does not know what he would have done without our help.

It would be a goal of Christian House to give everyone hope – hope and love and a second chance in life. We have tried for two years to find funding for this badly needed program, but have been turned down by everyone from Billy Graham to Perry Stone. I am writing this for God's people in the vision. I ask the Whole Body of Christ Alliance, in the name of Jesus, to help us find funding for this overdue and badly needed program.

Misunderstanding Christianity

Last month I wrote about theology and how it was like a map to understanding God. In the days in which we live, understanding God has never been more important, especially in light of all the popular "religions" and the oceans of

misunderstanding about him. When you really get down to it, isn't the most common misunderstanding by the world about Christianity simply this: that Jesus Christ was a great moral teacher and that if we would only take his advice we would be able to establish a better society and avoid anymore wars? Even though that statement is very true, it tells us only a tiny fraction of the whole truth about Jesus and Christianity. Even though it may be quite true, the statement has no practical importance whatsoever.

Although it is quite true that if we took Christ's advice we would be living in a happier world, we don't even have to go as far as the teachings of Jesus. If we are hanging the betterment of our society on the mere following of some philosophy, we could accomplish that by simply following the far easier philosophies of Plato, Buddha, or even Mark Twain. In following any of their philosophies we would get along far better than we do. But my question to you at this point is: So what? We have never followed the advice of any great teacher. Why would we start now? Why would we be more likely to follow the teachings of Jesus than any of the others? Because he is the best moral teacher? Think about that one for a moment. The truth is that if he is the best moral teacher, we would be even less likely to follow him. We cannot even handle the elementary lessons. How likely is it that we will follow the most advanced? If Christianity only means one more bit of good advice, then Christianity is of no importance. There has been more than enough good advice over the last 4000 years. A bit more makes no difference at all. Let's not even go there.

As soon as we look at any of the real Christian writings, as soon as we look at the actual word of God, we see that they are as far from this worldly misconception about Jesus as the Easter Bunny is from the resurrection of Christ. These writings say that Yeshua (Jesus) is the Son of God (whatever that means). They say that those who place their confidence in him can also become sons of God (whatever that means). They say that his death saved us from our sins (whatever that means).

There is no point in complaining that these statements are too difficult to truly comprehend. Christianity claims to be telling us about another world – another existence, something behind that world that we can touch and hear and see. You may think the claim false; but if it were true, what it tells us <a href="https://has.com/has.

The part of Christianity that gives us the biggest problem is the statement that, by attaching ourselves to Christ, we can become "sons of God." Many would say, "Aren't we all God's children?" There are actually two answers to this question depending upon how we look at it. To answer it in the strictest sense, in a word, the answer is no. We are not all children of God. John 1:11-13 says, "He came unto his own and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God."

On the other hand, the fatherhood of God is one of the main Christian principles. In a certain sense we are, no doubt, children of God already. I mean God has brought us into existence, he

loves us and takes care of us and in that way is like a father.

This may seem contradictory but, if you will indulge me for a moment, I will explain. Remember that the New Testament was originally written in Greek, not English. In English we use the word "children." In Greek, however, two words are used: hwee'-oss and tel-i-ah'-oh. The word hwee'-oss is more of a general reference to children. The same word can be used for babies, calves, puppies, etc. It is in this sense that we see the word used in Rom 8:14, 23 and it is this form of the word referred to in the use of the word "adoption" in Rom 8:15 and Gal 4:5. The word Tel-i-ah'-oh refers more to those who are actually begotten or born to someone as in John 1:12 or Rom 8:16.

You see then that when the Bible speaks about "becoming sons of God," obviously it means something else — something other than what most people mean when they speak of being children of God. And that brings us right to the very center of theology — we must use the map. One of the creeds says that Christ is the son of God, "begotten, not created": and it adds, "begotten by his father before all worlds." This is born up by scripture: John1:1 says, "In the beginning was the Word (Jesus), and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." In John8:58 Jesus said, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, before Abraham was, I AM."

This is the point where it is so very important that you understand that this has nothing to do with the fact that Christ was born on earth to a woman who was a virgin. I am not speaking here about the phenomenon of virgin birth. Instead, we are discussing something that happened before Nature was created at all – before time began. "Before all worlds" Christ is begotten, not created. What does that mean?

Begotten verses Created: To beget is to become the mother or father of. To create is to make. When you beget, you beget something of the same kind as yourself. A woman begets human babies; a bird begets little birds and a bee begets little bees. But when you make, you make something of a different kind than yourself. A bird creates a nest, a beaver creates a dam, a bee makes a hive and a man makes rocking chair – or he may create something more like himself, like a statue, or even a robot, which is very much like a man. But of course, it is not a real man; it only looks like one. It is incapable of breathing, digesting, or thinking. It is not alive

Now, that is the first thing we need to be clear on. What God begets is God; just as what man begets is man. What God creates is <u>not</u> God; just as what man creates is not man – regardless of how lifelike it appears. Even the most sophisticated computers do not actually think. This is the reason that men and women are not children of God in the sense that Jesus Christ is. They may be like God in certain ways, but they are not of the same kind as God. They are more like statues or pictures of God.

A statue has the shape of a man but it is not alive. In the same way, man may have the "shape" or likeness of God (I will explain), but he does not have life the way that God does. First of all, everything God made has some likeness to God. Space is like him in its hugeness. Not that the greatness of space is the same as God's, but it is sort of a symbol of it, or a translation of it into nonspiritual terms. Matter is like God in having energy: although physical

energy is a different thing than the power of God. The plant world is like him because it is alive and he is the "Living God." But life in the biological sense, is not the same as the life there is in God: it is only a kind of symbol or shadow of it. When we get to the animals, we find other kinds of resemblances in addition to biological life. The intense activity of insects, for example, is a first dim resemblance to the unceasing activity and creativity of God. In the higher mammals we get the beginnings of instinctive affection. That is not the same thing as the love that exists in God: but it is like it - kind of like a picture drawn on a flat piece of paper can be like a landscape. When it comes to people, the highest animals, we get the most complete resemblance to God that we are aware of. (There may be creatures in other worlds that are more like God than people are, but we are not aware of them.) People not only live, but love and reason: biological life reaches it highest known level in them.

What people do <u>not</u> have, at least in their natural condition, is spiritual life – the higher and different sort of life that exists in God. We use the same word for both in English – life. If, however, you thought that they were the same kind of life, that would be like thinking the greatness of space and the greatness of God were the same thing. In reality, the difference between biological life and spiritual life is so important that I am going to introduce the Greek words for these two kinds of life.

To understand these two separate words, let's take a look at scripture beginning with John 10:10. "The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." Now let's look at John 20:31. "... that believing you might have life, through his name." When the angel of God freed the apostles from prison in Acts 5:20, he told them, "Go and stand and speak in the temple to the people all the words of this life." In each of these verses the Greek word used for "life" is ZOE' (Dzo-ay). It does not mean the kind of life we usually think about. Instead, it refers to the kind of life God has: spiritual life – Zoe'.

If we look at some other scripture, we can see the difference in the two meanings. In Luke 8:14 we see, "... are choked with the cares, and riches, and pleasures of this <u>life</u>." I Tim 2:2 says, "... that we may lead a quiet and peaceable <u>life</u> in all godliness and honesty." In Peter 4:3 it says, "For the time past of out <u>life</u> may suffice us to have wrought..." In each of these verses the Greek word for "life" is BIOS. This <u>is</u> the thing we mean when we speak of life.

You see the biological kind of life, which comes to us through nature, and which (like everything else in nature) is always running down and decaying so that it can only be kept up by being renewed from nature in the form of air, water, food, etcetera, is BIOS. The spiritual life which is in God from all eternity, and in which made the whole universe is Zoe'. Bios has a shadowy or symbolic resemblance to Zoe': But only the sort of resemblance there is between a photograph and a place, or a statue and a person. A person who changed from having bios to having Zoë' would have gone through as big a change as a statue which changed into a person. This is exactly what Christianity is about. The world is a great sculptor's shop. We are the

statues and there is a rumor going around the shop that some of us are someday going to come to life.

Be not Deceived... Whatever Men Have Sowed

They Will Also Reap!

We have all heard the saying "What you don't know can kill you," and we realize it is sadly and frighteningly true. We've heard it said in regards to the pollutants in our water supply and new bacteria that are resistant to antibiotics. We've heard that there are carcinogens in processed foods, bacteria in chicken, and pesticides in fruits and vegetables. We know that the AIDS virus is not the last merciless killer that this fallen creation is going to produce and suffer.

The Hidden things can hurt and even kill

People get illnesses like AIDS or cancer, and they die because of things they were completely unaware of, or because of things they did not heed the warnings about. Ignorance of the things that can kill us is unfortunately never a defense against them. Ignoring them will not make them go away, nor will wishing on a star make them get any better. But dealing with them in a manner that God has truly inspired can bring about a miracle.

And, just as there are things like cancer that can kill us in the physical realm, so are there things that eat away at the fabric of our lives, in the emotional, mental and spiritual realm. Most people are simply unaware of these killers because they have not been taught.

You might think I'm referring here to the spiritual realm of demonic forces, but I am not. I'm speaking of something much more fundamental, much more persistent, and much more personal to every individual. I'm speaking of those things that are hidden in our own hearts and minds that are progressively destroying our lives and the lives of those around us.

Do not be deceived about sowing and reaping.

The Bible tells us clearly "BE NOT DECEIVED, God is not mocked; whatsoever

a man sows so also shall he reap. If he sows to the flesh he shall reap corruption; but if he sows to the spirit he shall reap eternal life."

This tells us at least the following;

First, sowing and reaping is a spiritual FACT that dramatically shapes and influences every one of us. What has been sowed into us by others and sowed into us by our own choices will grow. The blessings or the corruption we "reap" in our lives reveals the true nature of what has been "sown" into us by others and by our own choices.

Second, God is the one that ordained this principle and it works in accordance with His sovereign will. He will not be mocked, but we would be very foolish to continue to ignore what He has ordained.

Third, the reaping often occurs through people who were not even in our lives when certain issues were sown. And, because the harvest "reaped" is often much larger than the seed sown, what we reap affects not only us, but all of our relationships, and even the very circumstances around us. This principle works in spite of our sense of how unfair it seems to be that things sowed in ignorance in childhood could be so destructive to us and others later in adulthood.

Fourth, we are clearly told not to be deceived about this principle. We have heard sowing and reaping taught about in terms of giving financially and in other ways in the church. And, we have all heard the saying that what goes around comes around. But as a "western culture" are still largely uninformed about how pervasively this basic and very powerful principle works in all our lives affecting all of

Because we are unaware of so much that affects our lives, we are therefore also not as aware of how the Cross is the most powerful remedy against the law of sowing and reaping in our lives.

Trees are known by their "fruit."

In nature we know that what you plant determines what will grow. Scripture tells us that "everything begets after its own kind." We all recognize trees most easily by the leaf or fruit that they produce.

Similarly, what has been sowed earlier in our lives is often only truly recognized and understood when we are able to see the "fruit" that has been produced, i.e. reaped, much later. Most people only grasp the truth of sowing and reaping, when they "reap" something disappointing and painful in their adult lives that they can clearly and obviously connect to some experience, sin, or trauma from their past. Usually such fruit is produced repeatedly, and even cynically in our lives.

Because people often don't recognize that "bad fruit" in their lives is the inevitable reaping from previous sowings, they also don't know what to do with it, or how to prevent it from reappearing in their children. They often see the "bad fruit" in others, but end up judging them for it, not realizing that "at WHATEVER point they judge another, they also condemn themselves." (Rom 2:1-4)

We pity the children but then forget them as adults.

We are a culture of people who grieve when they see a domineering father shame his son in front of his teammates for an error in a ballgame, or when we see an angry mother humiliate a little daughter in the middle of a shopping mall. We feel sick with disgust when we hear that a woman has left her children at home alone for days at a time, whenever she ran off on a binge with her drug addict boyfriend. We tempted to take justice into our own hands when we hear the alcoholic down the street has been abusing or molesting his step daughter.

When the victims are children we see and grieve their plight. We can even understand how hard it is for them to fit in anywhere or to succeed easily at anything. We all seem to have some understanding of sowing and reaping when it's a little child's life being permanently scarred by abuse, neglect, divorce, poverty and humiliation. We feel we can even almost predict what their future holds for them, and we know the consequences will be far-reaching and long-lasting, as they carry around these deep emotional wounds of childhood.

But, then when children just like these grow up and live next door to us, we betray them and the mercy we once felt. We sit back judging them for their apparent rebellion, without the mercy that we once had for knowing what was sowed into them as children. We betray those who we once pitied. In fact, we prove that we would rather "feel pity" for the helpless children than act on behalf of the troubled adults that those children grew into.

For too many of us our instinctive passions of pity and anger on behalf of helpless children are all too often merely cheap sentiments that result in no real action - not when they're children and not when they're adults.

In comparison, compassionate ministry of the love of Christ and time spent ministering the power of the cross to a horribly messed up adult, who may even have violated our every sense of what is decent, would be very costly love indeed.

Reaping a whirlwind in the sweet land of liberty

This law of sowing and reaping is the very root and reason for the tidal wave of sin that is sweeping our nation destroying individual lives and the fabric of our communities. The Bible says that "He who SOWS to the wind WILL REAP the whirlwind." TV news broadcasts confront us daily with human ill and violence of such epidemic proportions that we are now being forced to face a terrible whirlwind.

In this land of freedom and opportunity, we have been promised that human desire coupled with right choices will give us the happiness we have idealized and longed for all our lives. We heard it for years in school. And now, even in the church the invitation to "receive Jesus" often sounds more like a promise of immediate and lasting happiness than a call to discipleship and gut-wrenching sanctification.

How could we, in the "Sweet Land of Liberty," come to such a time as this, and yet seem so ineffective against our greatest physical, emotional, and spiritual problems? Especially when we have so many opportunities to hear the Word of God, and in which so many people profess to be believers.

One answer is that for far too long people have been ignorant about the sowing and reaping that has occurred in their own individual lives, and even more ignorant of what sowing we have all done corporately. The "western mind," and even Christians, have been lulled into a state of unawareness, disregard, and deception about a principle that we were told not to be DECEIVED about.

The Word says, "My people perish for a lack of knowledge." Our collective ignorance of the FACT of sowing and reaping is a blind spot of devastating consequences in both our individual lives and in our community at large.

Because most people, including Christians only understand sowing and reaping to encompass their own actions and choices as adults, they keep trying to make their lives work by greater effort, i.e. striving in their flesh. All the while, the "bad fruit" in their lives continues to grow, hurting themselves and affecting others around them as well.

Tina spoke beginning in Isaiah 53:5, "He was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon him, and by his stripes we are healed." Then she quoted James 1:22, "Be doers of the word, and not hearers only deceiving yourselves." And held up James 4:17, "Therefore, to him who knows to do good and

does it not, to him it is sin.



"I came today," Announced Tina, "to talk about the danger of plans without action. The challenge for me is: I can be happy as long as there is a plan. But it takes action with that plan. The road to hell is paved with good intentions. Nobody intends to go to hell. They believe that it doesn't exist or that they will someday make things right. Intention by itself is worthless. David was only sent there for his brothers and he said, 'Who is this uncircumcised Philistine?' He didn't tell himself that some day he would fight the giant. He fought him. He had action with his plan.

"Look around **your** Promised Land. How far has the enemy moved into it?

"The Bible says that in Noah's time sin abounded but that Noah found favor with God and in Genesis 6:15 God told him the dimensions of the ark – 300 cubits (450 ft) long by 50 cubits (75 ft) wide by 30 cubits (45 ft) high. It was exactly six times longer than it was high. During WWII the allies needed a ship to carry a massive load of cargo and they used these same dimensions. It was called the USS Jeremiah O'Brian, nicknamed 'The Ugly Duckling.' What if Noah had said, 'One day I will build a boat' and never did? Noah carried out the plan with his action.

"Rahab had a plan:

XXXXXXXXXX ← outer wall (6 ft thick)

Space between the walls

XXXXXXXXXXX

XXXXXXXXXXX ← inner wall (20 ft thick) XXXXXXXXXXX

"People built their houses over the space between the walls of Jericho. It was a scarlet cord that saved Rahab and her family. The blood of Jesus is our scarlet cord. We are saved by the blood – we and our families.

"If you have had a dream placed in your heart, you <u>are</u> able because <u>He</u> makes it happen. You cannot wait until you see the whole picture. Just start working."

Those that would made a circle and prayed together that God would make it happen. The prayer was loud and much of it in tongues
