
On Saturday 6 April Pastor Walter Cleveland of Next Level Ministries Church delivered the sermon.

On Prayer V (Leaning on God)

A serious problem with praying that is more common than some might realize is trusting someone other than God. To avoid this we need to understand the provision that Jesus has made for us through his resurrection and ascension. Let & consider Heb 7:25-

õTherefore he is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through him, since he ever lives to make intercession for them.ö

Notice the phrase, õThose who come to God **through him**.ö Heøs not going to save to the uttermost those who come to God through a saint, Mary, a pastor, an apostle, or any other human. Heøs only going to save to the uttermost those who come to God õthrough him.ö

This is not an attack on Catholics. This õhail Mary syndromeö is as much a protestant problem as any thing else.

Jesus is our High Priest (prayer warrior) and is fighting for us. Heb 7:26-27 says, õSuch a high priest was fitting for us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens; who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for his own sins and then for the peoples, for this he did **once for all** when he offered up himself.ö

Do you believe these verses 6 that Jesus lives to make intercession for you? Do you believe that you dongt need anyone else to be your high priest? Too many of us dongt see him as a high priest. We see him as savior and Lord, but rarely as high priest. We need to see him as all three.

The first important aspect of Jesus we **need** to understand well is that of savior if we are to gain an inward assurance of forgiveness and justification. People (like me) who are saved as children often have a greater struggle gaining assurance of their salvation than those whose lives undergo a dramatic transformation. I found myself doubting my salvation.

I was convinced finally that, if my salvation depended even 1% on me, I was going to hell. I realized that my faith had to be either in the blood of Jesus or in my works. I realized that my only hope of escaping hell was his blood.

I know there are probably thousands of people or even more who grab the last part of Phil 2:12 (completely out of context) and say, ōYou have to work out **your own** salvation with fear and trembling ö

If any of us could õwork out our own salvationö we would not need Jesus. For a long time I was a victim of hearing so many preachers use this out of context. Rarely do these well-meaning folks look at the rest of it in verse thirteen, öFor it is God who works in you to will and to work for his good pleasure.ö Sometimes I want to say to those people that it would be better said, ö<u>If</u> you work out **your own** salvation, you **better** do it with fear and trembling.ö

To understand the basis for this misunderstanding, we actually have to go back to Phil 2:5-8, where Paul tells them (us) to have the mind of Christ. The command is to the entire group, not to any individual, since the Greek for öyouö is plural. He is speaking of their corporate salvation. The Greek word translated õwork outö is borrowed from the first century author Strabo, who uses it to describe digging silver out of silver mines. Thus salvation is compared

to a huge gift to be dug out. Paul encourages the Philippians to dig out their corporate salvation, not to *work for* their salvation. Then he adds that it is God who does it.

I John 1:7 became an anchor for me:

öBut if we walk in the light as he is in the light, we will have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his son cleanses us from all sin.ö

When I began to place my faith in the blood of Jesus and to understand he was my savior, I had the assurance of my salvation.

An assurance is different than salvation itself, but still, it is necessary for a healthy, peaceful life in God. It comes only from trusting completely in one thing ó the blood of Jesus Christ.

The second important aspect of Jesusø ministry we **need** to understand well is his position as resurrected Lord. When we truly internalize the resurrection of the Lord, we see that he not only died for us but also rose for us and lives within us. With this revelation we gain victory and sanctification. Stop for a moment and consider this wonderful realization: that he lives within us, not in theory but **in reality**. If you become cognizant of the fact that the power of the Godhead is inside you, you will conquer lust. You will conquer hate, resentment and Unforgiveness. You will conquer any of these things.

Paul articulated this reality in Gal 2:20 ó

õI am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ lives in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith in the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.ö

When you see what Paul saw, you will begin to see also your potential.

Let me explain this potential by saying this: If you are in Christ, and you trust in him and not in yourself, you dongt have to spend one more second trying to get Jesus <u>in you</u>. He <u>is</u> in you. He is never going to get ōinō you anymore than he already is. The real issue is whether you are going to let him out. Let him out to those around you. All his power, all his faith, all the things that he did that he said we would do as well (greater things than these will he do) come out of you attached to the love of Christ that is in you already. You can get up every morning and say, ŏI am a river of love, joy, peace, gentleness, patience, goodness, and meekness. I am going to let Jesus out of me.ö

You will finally see your potential. Knowing your potential in God is different than knowing you are forgiven. But to walk in both peace and victory, you must grasp both the forgiveness found in Jesus as savior <u>and</u> the potential found in Jesus as Lord.

The third important aspect of victorious living in Christ is being able to grasp an understanding of Jesusø exaltation. When he ascended to the Father, his ministry did not end. He is alive right now, praying for you. Please hear this: The key to prayer is to find out how the High Priest is praying; whenever you pray in agreement with him, you will receive an answer.

Who are you agreeing with? Jesus 6 a High Priest who õis able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through him, since he ever lives to make intercession for them.ö He is going to save us to the uttermost because he is exalted and sits at the right hand of God and prays for us.

At my church there is a box for prayer requests. It is common knowledge that my husband and I and our pastor review these requests and pray over them. Every week at least one person drops in a list of 25 prayer requests with 8 requests for healing, 10 requests for salvation, and every other kind of need. The person will literally take the time to write 4 or 5 pages of prayer requests and the say, õSister Mozelle, will you pray for these people?ö

Ave Maria is the prayer used primarily by Catholics. Part of the prayer says, õHoly Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners now and in the hour of our death. The problem with this prayer and the mindset behind it is that it ignores the fact that it is Jesus who is the high priest. Make no mistake; it is not merely a Catholic problem. It is just as much a Protestant problem.

It is one thing to ask someone to pray in agreement with you, but, if we are not praying, and asking someone to pray instead, we are saying three things. First, we are saying, õI know my prayer will not be answered.ö Second, we are saying, õI need to get someone to pray for me who I know can get her prayers answered.ö Third, we are saying, õI know I am not right with God, and I am not willing to repent to get right with God. And since I have no plans of repenting, I am looking desperately for a mediator. If it is not Mozelle Weeks, maybe Joyce Meyers, Kenneth Copeland, or Creflo Dollar will do.ö

This all shows a lack of revelation and understanding that the Son of God himself, who õis holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, andí higher than the heavens,ö is sitting on the throne saying, õI want to save you to the uttermost. I live to make intercession.ö õNever mind, Jesus. I am going to Pastor Soand-so.ö Isnøt that stupid? Many of us go to

and-so.ö Isnøt that stupid? Many of us go to others and say, õHail Pastor, full of graceí ö When we approach our pastor, or some other person and say, in essence, õHail Mozelle, Hail Johnny, Hail Sally Ann ó pray for me in the hour of my needö we are doing what many of our Catholic brothers and sisters do with the õsaintsö and Mary. We are placing our faith in someone other than the High Priest.

People do this because the third aspect of Jesusø ministry is not real to them. We have seen him as Savior and Lord, but many have never seen him as High Priest waiting for us to pray. He is waiting right now.

Nobody anywhere can possibly match Jesus as High Priest. Why do we look for someone else? We need to be reminded of the High Priestøs function. Jesus did not go back to heaven to just sit down and say, õYouøre on your own, folks.ö There are many people who treat God as if he just wound up the world after he created it like a clock and just lets it tick away on its own. When Yeshua went back to heaven, is that what he did? Did he say, õNow, I died for you, rose for you, and indwelled you. Good luck, I hope you make itö? Not on your life! The Bible says that he is able to save to the uttermost all those who come to God through him and that he ever lives to make intercession for us.

Therefore, it is a sin to make any person other than Jesus a mediator between us and God. Say that out loud. It is as much a Protestant problem as it is a Catholic problem. I Tim 2:5 tells us, othere is one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Jesus Christ. How many mediators are there? One! When we run with a

list of prayer requests to anyone, we are asking that person to be our High Priest.

Would you ask a pastor or a prayer warrior to be your Savior and Lord? Then why ask one of those people to be your High Priest? If you can get in your spirit a sense of Jesusø High Priesthood, your prayer life will be transformed. If the High Priest lives to make intercession, and if he is the mediator, then the key to prayer is for you and your one mediator to talk about your situation. If you can find out what the Lord is saying instead of just what you are saying, then you will get Godøs perspective.

Effective prayer involves more listening than talking. Prayer absolutely requires you to be a listener. You may believe that the solution to your situation is discipline. You may say, õLay on the discipline,ö but God may say, õLay on the love.ö If a situation requires discipline and you give it love, or if it requires love and you give it discipline, you can bring death. You must have a daily up-to-date relationship with Jesus that consists of both talking and listening. If you are not hearing from God you are I big trouble and will have to depend on man for advice.

This is what happened to King Saul. Unable to hear from God anymore, he went to a witch. If God will not talk to you, it will do no good to anywhere else. If he is not talking to you, it is your move. Get on your knees literally, and pray until the Spirit of God speaks to you.

This problem of prayer, this õHail Mary Syndrome,ö is simply transferal, which is removing the responsibility from one person and placing it upon another person. It is saying, õI am going to remove from myself the responsibility of praying for that person and place it on my pastor, or my godly friend.ö Ultimately, we are attempting to find someone other than Christ to be a mediator.

If you transfer the responsibility of praying to a pastor, consider this: No human now on earth can touch God for hundreds of people. It is almost always impossible for someone to pray for your loved ones as well as you can. You know them. You love them. The heart, the love, and the compassion will be in **your** prayer. Let us stop entering into prayer meetings and transferring our responsibilities.

Sometimes God will lead us to ask someone to agree with us in prayer, but never to transfer our own responsibility because he has provided us with a High Priest.

You will never understand intercession until you understand the High Priesthood of Jesus. To be able to move into a deeper prayer life, you must understand what is meant in Heb 2:17-18: õTherefore, in all things he had to be made like his brethren, that he might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for sins of the people. For in that he himself has suffered, being tempted, he is able to aid those who are tempted.ö

The Greek reads, õHe is able **to run to** the aid of those who are tempted.ö

This verse tells us that, as a human being, Jesus suffered and gained sympathy for us. He knows what it is to be tempted by anger. He knows what it is to be tempted to entertain wrong thoughts and wrong motives. He has sympathy for us 6 a clear and complete idea of what it is like to live in a human body. He was the Son of Man as well as the Son of God.

The one who sits at the right hand of God is able to run to the aid of those who are tempted. What kind of aid? He prays for us. He who died for us now sits in heaven mentioning us **by name** to God the Father. Knowing this will increase your faith and change the way you word your prayers. Itos like getting a government job. Itos not what you know, but who you know.

Once while praying for a lady after church, I took her hand and said, δL et α pray in tongues for a minute. δ As I stood there praying in tongues, I thought, Jesus wants this prayer answered more than I do, and he is holier than I am. He is perfect and ever lives to make intercession for us. I knew that the Holy Spirit had been born in me as an intercessor.

If the intercessor inside me is praying what the intercessor is praying at the right hand of God, then I will see and answer to prayer.

I took hold of that lady® hand and began to pray. The first part Mozelle prayed. Then, suddenly, I realized that I had reached a different level and was praying in agreement with Jesus. Tears began to flow as I realized a miracle would occur because the High Priest and I were praying the same thing.

So far everything I have said has laid the foundation for understanding, Heb 3:1, õTherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, Christ Jesus.ö

Jesus is the High Priest of our confession, not his confession! Whatever we speak, he turns to the Father and prays. We affect what Jesus prays for us by what comes out of our mouth! Perhaps you get up each morning and say, õI dongt have any joy. Igm tired of it all. Life is a rat race; which horse am I going to ride today?ö Jesus, who spilled his own blood for you, will turn to his father and say, õI canot pray that!ö Instead, what if you got out o bed and said, oThe Bible says the Lord is my strength, my courage, the love that is in me. He is my fortress and my strong, high tower. I am complete in him, and I dongt care how I feel! All that Christ Jesus is lives in me.ö That will make the High Priest get excited and turn to the Father and say, õDid you hear what she said? Be her strength, Father. Be her courage, her joy and her peace. Be her fortress. When Jesus turns to the Father and prays that prayer, the Father releases it, and the Holy Ghost pours it out on you.

Jesus is the High Priest of what you speak. You determine what he prays for you by your own confession, as long as it is clearly scriptural.

This same concept is also seen in Prov 18:20-21, õA manos belly shall be satisfied with the fruit of his mouth; and with the increase of his lips shall he be filled. Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.ö

If you speak it, you have to eat it. You spread the table of your life with your own mouth. If you begin to increase what you speak, you will increase what you receive. If you begin to speak faith and joy, Jesus will become the High Priest of what you have spoken. He will pray what you confess. This is not the same thing as õname it and claim it.ö You will not be confessing a new sports car or any other selfish prayer. You will eat what you speak.

Almighty God Refuses Access

READER® NOTE: There are many advantages to the body being in unity 6 many things that we cannot do unless we have it. We continue to lose battle after battle because we have not yet attained it. But it is not just a good idea; Almighty God commands it.

This #1 point of all speaking the same thing requires humility, wisdom, understanding, and knowledge. We know that, if we all are speaking the same thing, we are approaching the key to great spiritual power.

#2 we notice in I Cor 1:10 that there are to be no

divisions among us. The definition of denominationalism is: the tendency to divide into denominations or sects. Denominations are divisions. I Cor 1:10 exhorts us not to divide this way. We are to speak the same thing, and not divide. This is so simple, and yet profound, and even startling. The very thing we have come to accept as necessary is displeasing to God Almighty. Of course human beings tend to divide into groups, but we are born again. We are a new creation in Christ. It is not right for us to continue in the worldly ways, because old things have passed away, and all things have become new. The world will know we are Christøs disciples if we have love, one for another. Divisions manifest a relationship that is less loving than it ought to be. The world looks on at our schisms and is not impressed. An acquaintance of mine, who is an avowed atheist, made a comment similar to this: õWhat is going on with professing Christians drawing battle lines against one another?ö You know, he has a good point. Why should he want to become a Christian, when Christians do not love each other as they should? The stated goal in I Cor 1:10 is, that there be no divisions among us. Is there any Christian who would presume to have more wisdom than the Holy Spirit who inspired this passage? No divisions among you means no divisions among you. The basic tenets of the faith are within reach of our understanding, and these are not to be compromised; however, we must not permit less important things (notice I did not say unimportant things) to divide us into these denominational divisions. We must not walk in the flesh as the heathens do. We must not fight and quarrel as sinners do. We must not pack up our toys like the unbelieving world, when we do not get our way. There are to be no divisions among us for we are one in Christ. We are not supposed to be like the secular world.

#3 what about the phrase in I Cor 1:10 that says, õbut you be perfectly joined togetherö? This phrase comes with the idea of repair and restoration. We who were once sinners and lost, whose relationships were not one in Christ, are to be repaired and restored, if you will. How beautiful and pleasant this thought truly is. We being many, are one in Christ, and through Christ. As the scriptures say, we are all members of one body. Look at the word õperfectlyö. It does not simply say that we are to be joined together, but it says: perfectly joined together. There is no misunderstanding what kind of unity Almighty God desires. Will perfect unity be achieved through denominations? NO! They are probably the number one hindrance to unity in the body of Christ.

It was quite a generous gesture, considering this man had never sinned against Jesus. In fact, he did not know Jesus. If the blasphemous implications are not obvious to you, try this out on a fellow shopper at the supermarket. The religious leaders werenøt stupid. It did not take them long at all. oThe Pharisees and the teachers of the law began thinking to themselves, ÷Who is the fellow that

speaks this blasphemy? Who can forgive sins but God alone?@ Message received.

Be Not Deceived...

In Conclusion

After praying with so many broken people like Marcia, and so many confident people like Patti, I am grieved each time I see evidence that people have heard a gospel that puts the cross at the starting point of a believer walk in Christ, but fails to teach people of the ongoing place and purpose of the cross in their daily lives. Depriving children of God of the message of the

Depriving children of God of the message of the ongoing work and transforming power of the cross is robbery of the worst order, and our adversary the devil is a thief who accomplishes that and rejoices in it.

Jesus has given us the word, and the gifts of the Spirit, but the greatest of all is himself crucified in weakness for us, and is crucified and resurrected in him by the Holy Spirit. We are not only forgiven and cleansed by his blood, but we are also crucified with him, and our new life is his resurrection life within us.

All of us in some way have already õshared in the fellowship of Christøs sufferings,ö sometimes by merely being born into the circumstances of our families, and enduring the experiences of childhood, but we never understood that as children. Most do not understand as adults.

Having shared in his sufferings, we also therefore have an opportunity to be \tilde{o} conformed to the image of his death" by forgiving those who gave us less than what God the Father wanted us to have, and who killed the life that could have been produced in us the way Marciaos life got killed by those who did not bring her up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

And we have a hope of õattaining to the power of the resurrection" by the regenerating and transforming work of the Holy Spirit once we truly reckon our old life dead with Christ ó dead to our fears, offenses, longings and shame.

As we die to ourselves we will be transformed, but that death to our old self will also be an act of intercession for all those who have wounded and failed us in the past, for all those for whom the reaping has come in our adult lives, and for all those who have been frustrated and hurt by the unsanctified flesh that we have forced them to live with.



We are not told to make converts. Bishop Green is Headmaster of Jesus Christ School of Discipling. The school is scheduled to begin in May 2013.

What is the school all about? The school will begin its first class day on 18 May. Orientation is on 11 May. Applications will be taken up until that time or until the classes are filled. No one may attend who has not been interviewed and accepted. The school will produce ordained ministers of the gospel who will make disciples. The end point is not intended to be ordination, but becoming a disciple who makes disciples. Class sizes are limited and time is running out. The reverend Jeff Carr has been a church pastor, a speaker, and an author. He was once vice president of sales in New England for the WANG corporation. He left the corporate world for the ministry. He is a Christian counselor and has reconciled thousands of marriages, many that other worldly counselors wrote off as unsalvageable.

Jeff Carr was once with a team of counselors working for the government. They were charged with interviewing couples, who were considered irreconcilable and in the process of divorce, to try to find some answers to the things that cause divorce. He interviewed just over 3000 couples headed for divorce court. Ninety per cent of those couples were reconciled. No one else tried to help any of them turn away from divorce.

The reverend Mr. Carr has a counseling practice in Snellville, Cross of Christ Ministries. He counsels couples and individuals. He works on marriages in trouble, pastors and others in trouble, and has helped thousands of people realize their callings and pursue them.

His sessions are most unusual because he does not stop at the 50-minute mark as most counselors do. It is not all about the money for him. It is about the goal. Two and three hour sessions are not unusual for him. The session is over when something is accomplished or if you have to leave.


