On Prayer VI

(Obedience)

Let us consider another problem associated with prayer: that of finding God's will. I John 5:14-15 says, "Now this is the confidence we have in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of him." It is a 3-fold process: 1) we ask according to his will; 2) he hears us; 3) he answers our prayers.

There is an old saying that there are 3 answers to every prayer: Yes, no, and wait. That's a nice little saying, but it does not line up with scripture.

The scripture says that if God hears us, we have the petition. The implication is that if our prayers are not answered, God never heard them.

Nothing is wrong with God or his desire to hear and answer prayer. He is not an unwilling God that we should try twisting his arm. He wants to answer our prayers. Our problem, then, is that we present all kinds of petitions that have nothing to do with the will or purposes of God. Notice that prayer has to start with God's will. According to I John, our confidence is in the fact that we pray according to his will. Therefore, the first order of business is to realize that the listening is more important than the talking. After reading the scriptures, the first step is getting a word concerning our prayers rather than bombarding heaven to coerce, twist, and force our human wisdom (or more accurately, our lack of wisdom) on God. We pray until we know God's will. Then, if we pray according to God's will, he will hear us; because he hears us, we will have the petition.

An illustrative story begins in John 5:2 about a man who had come to the pool at Bethesda for 38 years trying to get well.

When Jesus saw that the man had been that way for a long time, he asked him, "Do you want to be made well?" I should think the answer would be obvious, but seen through a spiritual lens, as this man might have, it's anything but rhetorical. I mean, if you could be healed of lust or greed or anger or pride or lying, would you really want to? Just like this man whose life was defined by his disability, our lives too are arranged around such moral furniture and would look quite different without them. And what if "getting well" spiritually meant a painful amputation of a beloved habit, the denial of a personal passion or the death of a dream? Would you still want to be made well? When the patient is our souls and not our bodies, everything changes. The issue is no longer "can Jesus heal?" but "Do I want to get well?"

The primary point here, though is this, after healing the man, Jesus was questioned by the religious leaders concerning his healing the man on the Sabbath. Jesus' explanation is found in John 5:19, "The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he sees the Father do; for whatever he does, the son also does in like manner."

Jesus was a seer and a prophet. We are to be seers too, for we need to "see" what the Father is doing. Jesus said he could do nothing of himself. If the Lord could not heal this person unless the Father was healing him, then how much more must we say, "We can do nothing apart from the Father"?

There was a multitude of sick people at the pool, yet Jesus only healed one man. Why? He only saw the Father healing one person, and he moved with the Father. We see this "Seer Principle" again in John 5:30, "I can of myself do nothing. As I hear, I judge; and my judgment is righteous, because I do not seek my own will, but the will of him who sent me."

If it's true for the Son of God, it needs to be true for us. The key to prayer is to find out how heaven is moving and to line up with heaven.

Consider this in view of the literal translation of Mat 16:19, "And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

The verbs **loosed** and **bound** in this verse are actually perfect passive participles in the Greek, and are translated more accurately in the Amplified Version: "must be **already bound** in heaven" and "must be what is **already loosed** in heaven."

Whatever we bind must be bound in heaven. When heaven decides to release the antichrist, we can bind him until the cows come home, but he will not be bound because he is not bound in heaven. We do not control God Through prayer – we move with him in what he is already doing. The Lord once told me, "I will answer any prayer that Jesus is praying through you." Any prayer that comes out of your soulish realm is not going to be answered because it is not according to God's will; he will not hear it. But if I listen and receive a word of wisdom or a word of knowledge, I will pray his prayers and see them answered.

The point is that merely praying for God to do something will often be fruitless. We have to discern heaven's plan for that situation. True prayer is listening instead of simply shooting our guns off in the air. When we aim at nothing, we hit nothing.

The Bible says that if God listens to us, we will have our petition. That concept may drive us crazy because it implies that he does not hear much of what we pray. But let's be honest: many of our prayers just don't get answered, which suggests that God never heard them to begin with.

If we can become attuned to God's will in our prayers, we can proceed with confidence. For guidance let's look at Is 62:6-7, "I have set watchmen on your walls, o Jerusalem; they shall never hold their peace day or night. You who make mention of the Lord, do not keep silent, and give him no rest till he establishes and till he makes Jerusalem a praise in the earth."

Although the specific context of this scripture is for Jerusalem, the principle is true all the way around that we are to "remind the Lord" and "give him no rest" until his promise is realized. Once we have a word from God concerning a promise, we can approach him saying, "Lord, you said," or "Lord, you wrote..."

Once we have a scripture that applies to our situation – once God gives a word, especially a word in *the Word* – then we can take hold of it, stand on it, and pray it.

This theme of reminding God is also seen in Is 43:26, where he tells us to put him "in remembrance; let us argue our case together, state your cause, that you may be proved right." Too often we have no case. Then the Lord says, "What scripture are you basing your prayer on?"; or, "Are you willing to get out of the sin that has created your problem?"; or, "You are

under the chastisement of God, and it will not be lifted."

We need to know what we are doing before we come before God. Remember, Jesus said not to use "vain repetitions as the heathens do" (Mat 6:7). It is not how much we pray, but how accurately we pray.

Do you think America should be spared? If you go before God and pray, "I am claiming that America will escape World War III," you may not have a case. You cannot simply show up in heaven and command God, as if you were God and he were your servant. It is impossible to be strong in prayer if you are not strong in scripture. (See Is 41:26.)

This concern for the scripture implies an obedient reverence for its authority. Most Christians are not serious about obedience. They believe in obedience in theory, but when it comes down to verses that disagree with their lives, they say, "That doesn't apply to me."

Consider the divorce rate among believers. If a Christian married couple is serious about God, how could they even consider divorce an option? A believer cannot help it if his or her spouse leaves. But that particular case aside, there are thousands of Christians divorcing. Apparently, the Bible has no influence in their lives. Obedience is all in theory.

If a Christian takes obedience seriously, she could not even consider marrying an unbeliever. If a believer took obedience seriously, she would **have** to tithe. Many people don't even pray about tithing – the Bible says do it. If a woman takes obedience seriously, she could not **have** an abortion; it would not be an option.

Many Christians think the Bible is authoritative until it crosses them.

In a vision the Lord took me many places, but the last one was a stinking, filthy basement, filled with every kind of disgusting garbage, much of it pushed up in piles and against the wall. Roaches darted everywhere, as did rats, and maggots dominated every pile of garbage. Young people, mostly teens were all around us in the basement, drinking, smoking, having a party in the middle of this garbage. When I asked the Lord why these people were having a party in the garbage, he replied, "Some people are disobedient and have stepped down into this filthy basement. This is where the disobedient are today. It is their spiritual condition. They want to stay here, so they attempt to clean it, but it cannot be cleaned. Their only hope is to leave it - to move out of it."

I asked why most were so young, and he answered, "They are not young. They only appear to be young because that is their level of spiritual maturity. They will never mature in a place of disobedience. They pay a very high price to stay here. Many of those who believe that they know me live here in disobedience, but I do not know any of them."

There was another room there, and in it was a pit about 25 feet deep with a ladder leading down into it. Before I realized it we were at the bottom of this dimly lit room (pit). People were huddled all around in it. Some wept. Some just stared into the distance. All were in despair. The Lord said, "Those who will not leave the filthy basement will come into this pit of sorrow, shame, anguish, depression, and mental problems. They call it schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and a hundred other names invented by men, but their problem is sin."

I followed him through another dimly lit doorway, and down another set of stairs. We came into another room that was lit by the kind of light that comes from a fire. We walked past more people weeping and wailing, each one by themselves, curled up naked and alone. We walked past them to another pit from where the fiery light was emanating. I was filled with the anguish and depression that the people all around us were filled with. I began to sob uncontrollably and the Lord spoke.

"There is no cleaning the filthy basement so that one can stay in it. They must come out of it or they will be in the pit of despair, which leads to this pit lit with the false light of the evil one. Here they will take their own lives or otherwise jump into this pit of deception. This is the pit of hell. So few of them see where they are going. They allow themselves to get into adultery, but they will not stop. They become addicted and are too lost and afraid to seek my help. This light is the voice of the evil one, who tells them that sin is enjoyable. He tells them that fornication and adultery are acceptable, to use drugs and practice sorcery, to make alcohol their god because 'everyone else is doing it.' Believers must be different. They must come out from among those in the world, who have no hope. They are to run away from sin or they will jump into this pit. When they seek me, I will always deliver them, but they must seek me." Pray until you are free.

Let's examine this concept of obedience beginning in John 15:4: "Abide in me, and I in you." The word abide is derived from a Greek word meaning "to live," "to dwell, or "to remain." For purposes of this article, I will use the word remain.

Remain in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it remains in the vine, so neither can you, unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who remains in me, and I in him, he bears much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. If anyone does not remain in me, he is thrown away as a branch, and dries up; and they gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned. If you remain in me, and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it shall be done for you."

Our first prayer request should be to abide in Christ. This means that you have no willful sin, no bitterness toward any person, no one left unforgiven, no wrong relationship, no lust, no pornography, etc. To remain in Christ is to remain in the spirit. That means, as far as you know, there is nothing in your life that displeases Jesus. If you do not begin praying about obedience, you are just playing games about prayer.

We must go back to basics, start all over again: "Lord, my prayer is that I might be serious about obedience." You see one reason our prayers are not answered is in John 15:7 - If you remain in me and my words (scripture) remain in you, ask whatever...

The opposite of abiding is living in an unclean basement: "I'll allow just a little sin here, a little anger there, a little beer in the refrigerator here, a few cuss words there, a dirty story here, some cheating there. I wonder where God is. How come he never hears me?"

The Lord our God is one Lord. If you have two lords, he is not Lord. You need to pray earnestly, "I shall love the Lord my God with all my heart (plans, motives - no plans but God's

plans). I shall love the Lord my God with all my soul (my emotions directed completely to Jesus). I shall love the Lord my God with all my mind (wholesome, pure thoughts). I shall love the Lord my God with all my strength."

A most excellent prayer would come from John 15:4. "Lord, help me to abide in you because apart from you I can do nothing, including getting an answer to prayer."

Remember we are to remind the Lord by praying the scripture. Begin to pray, "Lord, I choose to pay attention to your commandments. I want well-being, peace like a river, and righteousness like the waves of the sea." (from Is 48:18). If we want peace, we must be obedient.

In Is 59:5, the Lord speaks of those who "hatch vipers' eggs and weave spider's web; he who eats of their eggs dies, and from that which is crushed a viper breaks out." How can anyone pray who has viper's eggs or spider's webs in his heart? Do you have any living spiders? You must crush them. Do you have any little snakes? You need to kill them and begin down the road of obedience.

Is 63:10 is one of the most frightening verses in the old testament: "But they rebelled and grieved his Holy Spirit; so he turned himself against them as an enemy, and he fought against them."

I would sure hate to rebel against the Holy Ghost and grieve him until he turned, became my enemy, and fought against me.

There are people who have grieved the Holy Spirit through bitterness, hatred, and rebellion, and now he is opposing them because they are walking in paths of sin. Instead of living under the blessing of God, they are living under the woe of God. If you have a rebellious nature, rebel against the forces of darkness.

Is 65:2 talks about disobedience, but contains some good news: "I have stretched out my hands all day long to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own thoughts.'

God stretches out his hands even to those who are rebellious. He wants us to be obedient so that we walk in a way that is good and not one that will hurt us.

In Mark 14:35-36 we see real obedience: "He went a little farther, and fell on the ground, and prayed that if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. And he said, 'Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Take this cup away from me; nevertheless, not what I will, but what you will."

Jesus said these words knowing he could not escape the cross and be obedient. His flesh did not want to go to Golgotha, but he obeyed the Holy Spirit instead of his soulish realm. There was never a time when he allowed his flesh to be in rebellion against the Holy Spirit.

It is important to realize that Jesus could have been disobedient had he not spent time in prayer. You and I will always be disobedient if we don't pray. In verses 37-38 he found his disciples sleeping and told them to "watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

Jesus had just learned that the spirit was willing, but the flesh was weak. Nevertheless, he went to the cross because he had won the victory the night before on his knees and on his face.

Would you like to have your flesh crucified every day? The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak. To crucify your flesh, keep (see pg 4)

Almighty God Refuses Access

Read further on in I Corinthians chapter one, verse eleven. "For it hath been declared unto me of you, my brethren, by them which are of the house of Chloe, that there are contentions among you. Now this I say, that every one of you says, I am of Paul; and I of Apollos; and I of Cephas; and I of Christ. (see pg 4)

watch with him one hour each morning. If you will spend an hour with him, you will have the Spirit in control instead of the flesh.

It is God's will that you abide; therefore, if you pray to abide, he will hear you, and you will have the petition. When the chips are down, you will crucify the flesh just as the savior did.

Almighty God (from pg 3)

Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?" Notice the question phrase: "Is Christ divided?" Ask yourself the same question. Is Christ divided? Of course Christ is not divided. Is the church divided? Yes! Back in the Corinthian church, they were divided into their exclusive groups. One group thought they were "in the know", because they took their ques from Paul. Think about that. They apparently were not going to listen to Cephas (i.e. Peter) or Apollos. But the Cephas group felt the same way. They took their instructions from Peter. The Apollos group too was a respecter of persons. They held Apollos in higher esteem than others. It appears that there was one more group that basically had it right, for their declaration was: "I am of Christ." The fact remained though, they were quarreling with each other about this.

This same thing goes on today. The Methodists almost worship John Wesley. The Baptists take their instructions from John Calvin. The "Church of God" people esteem A. J. Tomlinson. The Lutherans took to Martin Luther. The list goes on and on. The church is, without reservation, divided. You can see in this passage how Almighty God feels about this. In verse thirteen Paul asks, "was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?" Do you see what the Holy Spirit is saying here? Christ is the one who was crucified for our sins, and we are baptized in the name of Christ, and not in the name of Paul, Peter, Apollos, or any other human.

If you read on down to verse 31, notice it says, "He that glorieth, let him glory in the Lord." Over and over and over, I have witnessed professing Christians glorying in their denomination. This word glorieth means to boast or rejoice. We are not to boast or glory in men, but in Christ. If it were possible to put it more simply or more plainly than this, then I would do so. Please take note of what the Spirit is teaching us here. These denominational and human icons are far inferior to Christ, and we are to trust in him, not them. These people spoken of in I Corinthians, chapter one, were not of the same mind, or the same judgment. They were speaking inconsistent things. They had divisions, and were not perfectly joined together. Nothing has changed in this respect. The Body of Christ, the church, is splintered into numerous divisions. What is it about mankind that is so predisposed to separating into groups, and why is the Body of Christ so like the worldly crowd in this sense? From this perspective, it is little wonder, that Christ said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God." I Cor 12:25 states, "there should be no schism in the body." Schism has to do with splitting and division. I tell you authoritatively, and on the authority of the word of Almighty God, that we are to cease and desist from dividing the church. We are not to compromise the crucial tenets of the faith, but we are to become one. I, Mickey McConnell,

did not inspire these words, but the Holy Spirit did inspire them, as stated in the passages we have been considering. May his kingdom come, and his will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Do you esteem any denomination over any other? Please have ears to hear. Almighty God does not want you to play favorites with any group of Christians. Your preferred denomination must not in any way cause you to play favorites. You and I as Christians must place all out brothers and sisters in Christ on a level playing field. We are not to esteem one group of Christians as better than others. Listen! It displeases Almighty God. Prov 6:16, 19 informs us, that it is disgusting to the Almighty to sow discord among brethren.

Organization of Church Alliance

It was brought out at the 7-day revival in April that it takes money to fight Satan. Any organization needs money to function, and the church alliance is no exception. Money is needed to go and meet new churches and to fund the Battlefield News. Money will be needed to fund any events done to introduce the general public to the alliance. Extra money would be helpful to bail out small congregations that may be having problems meeting expenses. I firmly believe that times are going to get very difficult, and Christians are going to be hunted, and forced to band together. Supplies will have to be purchased in order to survive. If a bank account was started now, and each church in the alliance would tithe 10% each month of the tithes received, it would not take long to see a large growth in the money available. There would be money to help the needy, promote the alliance, and fund special events. Money would be available to fund Rick Hempton in his quest to draw more churches into the alliance. Money would be available to get the Battlefield News published on time each month.

Now let's talk about the problem of getting people in the individual churches offering their time. I am aware that last year there was an attempt to form a committee to deal with matters of the alliance. Secretary is needed. A treasurer will be needed to look after the funds. Subcommittees could be put into place to set up special events, such as the Unity March that took place last September. More communication needs to be arranged between the various churches so that they are better informed of events coming up so that they can not only support each other in these events, but also so that they will stop planning events that compete with each other and with things like the 7-day revivals. Phone numbers and e-mail addresses

of leaders of each church needs to be published so that they could be handily contacted in a timely manner. Until this happens, however, each church can contact the Battlefield News to have their events published. If they do not make contact in time for a print deadline, they can print flyers to be placed in each issue before it goes out.

These are just some of the things the Lord has been laying on my heart to deal with on this matter. I thought that I would put it out there to be considered and possibly acted upon.

"I come to speak on unity as it pertains to the Great Commission," began Mr. Parks, and he began in Eph 4:8-13. "This tells us that the saints are to do the work of the ministry, not just the pastor. Mat 28:18-20 says all power in heaven and in earth, go ye therefore... This is to come from the saints, not the Apostles, prophets, evangelists etc. **Their** job is to **equip** the saints to disciple. A disciple is to be as a sort of apprentice. The disciples are not just supposed to learn, but to put into practice.

"The body has a crisis mentality because the time is short. Therefore, they place a priority on making converts and leaving them to grow in Christ on their own. So, we make converts instead of disciples. I Sam 13:13 says, 'You have done foolishly. You have not kept the commandment of the Lord your God.' We are to teach people to teach people. We need more Bible colleges that are free. One is scheduled to open in May – Jesus Christ School of Discipling."
