On Prayer XVIII The Place (Part two)

Another great truth about Jacob's encounter is that through intercession heaven and earth are connected. In his dream, Jacob saw a ladder (or a stairway) extending from earth to heaven, with angels ascending and descending on it. The activity of heaven was being released on earth. Yeshua said to pray for this when he taught us to ask for God's kingdom to come and his will to be done on earth as it is in heaven (Mat 6:10). In Gen 28:17 it says, "And he [Jacob] was afraid and said, 'How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, the gate of heaven!" He realized it was a portal (entry point) for God's will to penetrate earth. Pawga places become gates to heaven where God's will is released onto earth.

We dealt with this a little a couple of months ago – the connecting or meeting of heaven and earth through intercession – so we don't need to say a lot about it here. It is enough to say that intercession joins heaven and earth, releasing the will of God into situations.

This does lead us, however, into the next great truth in this story. In the <u>place</u> of intercession, divine-&-human partnerships are formed. In this story of Jacob, heaven and earth were connected, but also God told Jacob that he was going to greatly bless <u>him</u>, "an in you and your descendants shall all the families of the earth be blessed" (Gen 28:14). A part of our destiny as followers of Christ is the privilege of partnering with God in helping others find their destinies. God wants to bless others through our efforts and prayers.

There is a man most of us have never heard of by the name of George McCluskey. He got married and started a family, and because he wanted his children to know the Lord, he devoted and hour a day to pray for them. Eventually, he was also praying for his grandchildren and great grandchildren.

As the years went by, things changed, but George never changed his praying. His two daughters asked Christ to be the ruler of their lives, and both married men who went into full-time ministry. The two couples had 4 girls and a boy. Each of the girls married ministers and the boy became a pastor.

The first two children to this generation were boys, cousins. They graduated high school and were roommates at the same college. One boy went into the ministry, the other didn't. Instead, the second boy pursued a doctorate in psychology.

He eventually wrote books for parents that became best sellers. He eventually started a radio program that played daily to over a thousand stations. His name was Dr. James Dobson.

George McCluskey partnered with God in the **place** of intercession, and God's destiny for James Dobson was realized. His ministry has blessed many families on earth. The next time you are blessed by Focus on the Family or one of James Dobson's books, thank God for the intercession of George McCluskey.

Another important truth about **Pawga** places is that **angelic activity is released** there. Gen 28:12 says, "And behold, a ladder was set on the earth with its top reaching to heaven; and behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it."

Benny Wright and Charles Williams had attended a church service in Nebraska and were on their way home to San Antonio, Texas, in a single engine airplane. Alerted to the possibility of threatening weather, the believers in Nebraska were covering them in prayer. As the men prepared to land, a strong downdraft caused the airplane to collide with a power line and crash. They ran to safety, and amazingly, the only injury they suffered was a minor cut. When they looked back, expecting to see the plane explode, they saw two gigantic men dressed in white robes, hovering over the plane. These angels had undoubtedly delivered the men from destruction, a result of intercession.

The building of altars for our lives is another truth seen in this story about the place of intercession. Gen 28:18 says, "So Jacob rose early in the morning, and took the stone that he had put under his head and set it up as a pillar, and poured oil on its top." The word "pillar" could be translated as a memorial stone or a monument. In Old Testament times, altars were built not only as places of sacrifice but also as memorials to mark and remember significant events. We do much the same today in building memorials at great battle sites or in memory of great leaders.

Joshua erected two memorials where he and Israel crossed the Jordan River into Canaan (Josh 4:8-9). Abraham built and altar to the Lord at Shechem where God first promised him the land of Canaan. Gen 12:7 says, "And the Lord appeared to Abram and said, 'To your descendants I will give this land.' So he built an altar there to the Lord who had appeared to him. Samuel built an altar near the town of Mizpah to mark a victory the Lord gave Israel over the Philistines (I Sam 7:12). He named it Ebenezer, meaning, "the stone of help," stating, "thus far the Lord has helped us."

How does this altar-building relate to us today? Are we supposed to build literal altars or memorials? That, of course, isn't necessary. Yet we do build them in our hearts.

There was a young girl who had been in a coma for $2^{-1/2}$ years. Her brain was basically destroyed, eaten up by infection from a viral encephalitis. After a year or intense and persistent intercession, to the amazement of the medical world, the Lord restored her completely. After spending 60-70 hours praying during a one year period over her lifeless body, I will never forget the day I saw her awake and alert. I built a memorial there.

Today, when nagging doubts try to trouble my mind to convince me that God will not come through for me in a particular situation, I revisit my Ebenezer. Quietly I whisper, "Thus far he has helped me."

I have many such altars. One stands in Guatemala where the little girl (mentions a few months ago) used to be tied to a tree. Another stands at the place where I prayed for my husband Richard, and God healed him of prostate cancer. I also "built" one where I first met him, and where each one of our children was born. There are many others, all stand as monuments to the faithfulness of God in my life.

You will build your own altars, as you live a life of intercession, creating meetings between your God and other individuals, lighting on Bethels where destinies are shaped where heaven meets earth, or simply receiving personal help from your faithful Father, you'll find many

appropriate places to erect Ebenezers. Build them strong enough to stand the test of time and tall enough to be seen from far away.

Almighty God Refuses Access

Now read Luke1:67-69, "And his father Zacharias was filled with the Holy Ghost, and prophesied, saying, Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people, And he raised up an horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David; as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets, which have been since the world began: that we should be saved from our enemies, and from the hand of all that hate us; to perform the mercy to our fathers, and to remember his holy covenant; the oath which he swore to our father Abraham, that he would grant unto us, that we being delivered out of the hand of our enemies might serve him without fear, in holiness and righteousness before him, all the days of our life. And you child shall be called the prophet of the Highest: for you shall go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways; to give knowledge of salvation to his people by the remission of their sins, through the tender mercy of out God; whereby the dayspring from on high has visited us, to give light to them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace." Once again we see the phrase, 'filled with the Holy Ghost," and once again it is identical to the post-Pentecostal passages. The initial evidence here is the same as the one in Acts 19:6. I want you to notice clearly that, as soon as Zacharias was filled with the Holy Ghost, he did not speak in tongues, but he did prophesy. We could also mention Mary the mother of Christ, in the passage in Like 1:46, and Simeon in Luke 2:25, and even lesser formidable passages in then Old Testament. I can almost hear the objection: "But these were prior to Pentecost and the infilling spoken of by Christ." The problem with this argument is this: we are talking about the one-&-only Holy Spirit, in the earth, in humans. Apparently the only real difference between now and then, is that the Holy Spirit was not available to every believer back then, but only to certain ones chosen by Almighty God, and now his infilling is available to all believers. Anyone can look for themselves and see that the result was the same, only there is not a single mention of tongues. I am not saying by this, that tongues are not valid. Tongues are a valid gift, as we have already discovered earlier on. I am saying, and the scriptures are confirming, that tongues are not the one and only initial evidence of being filled with the Holy Spirit. Now let us examine the 5 passages available to us in Acts.

The best as I can tell, the Holy Bible gives us 5 examples of people being filled with the Holy Spirit in Acts. There is that great passage in Acts Chapter 2 concerning the Day of Pentecost. We also have mention in Acts 4,8, 10 and 19. In Acts Chapter 2 they spoke with the tongues of many nations. In Acts 4:31 the only manifestation mentioned was that they spoke the word of Almighty God with boldness. In Acts 8:15-17 we find people being filled with the Holy Spirit, with absolutely no mention of what the manifestation was. In Acts 10:1-48 we find that being filled with the Holy Spirit was accompanied by two initial evidences, the first being tongues, and the second being magnifying Almighty God. In Acts 19:2-6 we find that, when they were filled with the Holy Spirit, two initial evidences accompanied them, the first being tongues, and the second prophesying. Two out of five make no mention of tongues, though the Word speaks clearly of them being filled with the Holy Spirit. Because the tow passages that make no mention of tongues are present in the scriptures, we cannot possibly and honestly conclude that everyone who is filled with the Spirit will have the initial evidence of speaking in tongues. It is not objective to say so; it is stretching and forcing the scriptures to support our doctrine. Someone might say, "They may have spoken in tongues at these two times as well, without having made mention of the fact." That is truly a possibility. It is also possible that many other things took place. However, it is not right to make a doctrine out of what might have been. Some folks seem to believe that the initial evidence of being filled with the Holy Spirit will be just like it was at Pentecost. If this were true, then there would always be the sound of a rushing mighty wind; furthermore, there would be cloven tongues like as of fire sitting on the persons being filled with the Holy Spirit. This rarely happens, if ever. Whoever would insist that there has to be an initial evidence of tongues, must also insist on the sound of a rushing mighty wind, along with the cloven tongues as of fire sitting on the ones being filled, but you pretty much never hear of such a thing. We are not free to pick and choose things like these to suit ourselves. I submit to you that the Holy Spirit is completely free to fill anyone any way He chooses, regardless of how he did it at Pentecost, or any other time, and there is no evidence in the scriptures to the contrary. In fact, the Holy Bible says in John 3:8 these words, "The wind blows where it is so inclined, and you hear the sound thereof, but cannot tell where it comes and where it goes; so is everyone that is born of the Holy Spirit." This passage demonstrates the unpredictability of the Holy Spirit. You cannot be certain how the Holy Spirit will choose to handle a matter, and it is quite presumptuous to believe that we have the Holy Spirit all figured out. I have learned by experience that Almighty God seems to delight in doing things in an unexpected way. If you say it will be a certain way, most likely the Holy Spirit will choose to do it differently just to show once again, that Almighty God alone is sovereign.

the Board of Commissioner's meeting to see how it was conducted and where it was held. The week after they met with Kevin Poe, the County Manager. It became clear that a major Christian presence was needed at the Board of Commissioner's meeting on 16 June. Therefore, the three men began working to arouse the attention of the body of Christ not only to the problem, but to the solution, by making

hundreds of telephone calls, communicating on social media, and speaking to church assembly after church assembly. In addition, Pastor James Walker announced the situation over the radio at WXAG, countless pastors addressed their congregations on the issue including pastor Allen Stevens, who showed up with a large number of people from Living Hope Christian Fellowship in Hoschton. Many pastors were present with their more dedicated people, including Pastors James Walker, Willie Harris, Billy Angel, Scott Lance, Patsy Garrett, Jeff Carr, Scott Bagwell, James Loyless, Karen Lewis, Herschel Phillips, Bobby Ivester, and many more.

When Greg Brockman addressed the Board of Commissioners, he began by reading an excerpt from the Georgia Bill of Rights:

"Freedom of conscience: Each person has the natural and inalienable right to worship God, each according to the dictates of that person's own conscience; and no human authority should, in any case, control or interfere with such right of conscience."

At this point, the entire audience stood to their feet and applauded, whistled, and shouted.

This portion was followed by the reading of the formal letter from Greg and the Whole Body of Christ Alliance:

"Upon reading the language of section 351 (d), we and others have become concerned that this ordinance could be used to infringe upon the religious and free speech rights of citizens in Jackson County. We have determined that the language is so broad that it is given to the interpretation of whoever may be in a position of power at any given time. Our concern is that the language could be used to limit or monitor home Bible studies, home church cell groups, home prayer meetings, or any other small gathering that may be of a religious nature.

"While it is understood that a large gathering that may need parking or may somehow infringe upon neighbors should require a permit, it should also be understood that a small meeting in a person's living room to pray or study the Bible should need permission from no one."

There was, at the reading of this section, another standing thunder of applause with whistling, shouting, and cheering that seemed almost to shake the floor of the courthouse. Greg Brockman was forced to stop reading until the sounds subsided.

"The wording of the amended ordinance could contain a clause that states, 'gatherings on private property need no permit as long as there is ample privately provided parking and the assembly does not violate predetermined fire code ordinances or noise ordinances."

"We believe that, as American Citizens and Citizens of the State of Georgia, we should not have to ask any government agency or official to have a few people over to our homes to pray or sing or study or what have you." (Another thunder of applause) "We have all seen the examples in several other states where people, especially Christians, have been prosecuted, spent time incarcerated, and been subject to heavy fines because those in a position of power chose to enforce ordinances like this one by the letter of the law. Another concern is that one of the organizations dedicated to the disassembling of religious freedoms may bring a law suit forcing counties to enforce such ordinances by the letter of the law. We feel that an amendment to this ordinance is needed to protect not only

our freedom, but the freedom of our children and future generations."

A final standing ovation occurred at this point. Vice Chairman Dwain Smith told those present that he was a Christian and recommended that "Four of five of y'all get together with the County Manager to amend 351d.

Commissioner Chas Hardy stated, "A few sentences in a book this thick (using his hands to show the thickness of the book of ordinances) can cause a problem for folks trying to do good. It's up to you citizens to see this kind of thing." Commissioner Bruce Yates moved that Kevin Poe (County Manager) look into amending section 351d.

The remainder of the meeting went according to the agenda. Bruce Yates and Chas Hardy thanked everyone for turning out and encouraged all to come to every meeting of the Board of Commissioners, stating, "What you put into your community is what you will get out of it."

About half the people stayed after the meeting and there was a Holy Ghost Meeting-After-the-Meeting



The meeting-after the meeting ended with those who stayed for all of it in prayer.

The Jackson Herald reported that the ordinance in question was from 2012. It was actually from 2003. The Jackson County BOC was never actually under fire. Although there were some present who were clearly ready for a fight, there never was one. There was no fight to it. The BOC agreed with the people from the beginning. It was a victory that was better than anticipated.

Katie Griffin of the paper, on the other hand, reported the ordinance as "overreaching," which it is. She also accurately reported that the wording of the ordinance reads, "Religious services conducted on a site that is not permanently occupied by a religious assembly use, not to exceed a period of more than 15 days."

Many people were present at the meeting. Some came ready to fight, some came and kept the proper sense of respect for the authorities God appointed over us. Whatever the case, Almighty God provided the victory.

"When Mary was told she would have a child, she said, 'Let it be unto to me according to your word.'

"Deliverance is <u>not</u> casting out demons. Your learning begins with your integrity. When you eat food, it is gone. It served its purpose, but you must eat again. It is the same with the word of God.

"In Ex 6:6-9 God told Moses to tell the Israelites all that God would do for them, but V_9 says, 'but they did not heed Moses because of anguish of spirit and cruel bondage.' All they could see were issues. You miss what God has for you because of your level of bondage. We are not different than the Israelites. When we pray, it's all about what $\underline{\mathbf{we}}$ want, what $\underline{\mathbf{we}}$ need. God is speaking. This was Israel's salvation.

"The Torah (the Law) is not salvation. By the way, how many times have you said, 'I am not under the law?' If you are not under the law, how will you call yourself a son of Avraham? Stop claiming just the parts of the Bible you want. Either accept it all or reject it all. Well, any way, the law is not salvation because it was received at Mt. Sinai when they were already out of Egypt. If the law was salvation to the Israelites, they could've received it in Egypt and gotten themselves out of Egypt. While they were still in Egypt, they could not understand what God was saying because of their bondage. "Col 1:9-13, 'For this reason we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to ask that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might, according to his glorious power, for all power and patience and long suffering with joy; giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the saints in the light. He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins.'

"...delivered us from the power of darkness...'
Deliverance is out of something into what was intended. It is not a simple casting out of demons. Moses was the first deliverer. So, if

deliverance is the issue, go back to the first person who did it. Leaders, you are not necessarily helping your people by just casting out demons. True deliverance is bringing them out of where they are to where they are supposed to be. You may have to deal with demons, but **that** in itself is not deliverance. They must be brought out of the domain of darkness to where they are supposed to be. It is the state of being liberated. A person may no longer have demons, but this alone does not mean they have been delivered. We only want to get free from ourselves and for ourselves. We are selfish.

"Bondage is slavery, involuntary servitude. Many people have been Christians for 20 or 30 years, been in church all that time and are still in bondage to something. There has to be more than just coming to church. Yeshua did not die just for that. He died to take me somewhere. He said, 'I am the way and...' Christians don't want to be honest about it, but many are <u>not</u> free. The world laughs at us for this. We are not free.

"Where is the power of the resurrection when you say, 'Well, God knows my heart,' or 'This is just where I am.'? Natural bondage is imprisonment often times within a hostile environment and violent confinement. Prisoners of the legal system often become more comfortable in their incarceration than they are when free. The same is true with Christians. They are more comfortable in their bondage.

"Why, if half-way houses are successful, are they located in the same sort of neighborhoods as the people who live in them came from, and not in places like Beverly Hills? If you want to change me, bring me out of this **place**. To be changed, to be transformed, you must get out of where you are – not just the location, the mindset.

"Teshuah' literally means "return." How can it be a return, a deliverance? Watch this:

You see, they **were** there in Abraham. Getting closer to God is getting **back** to where we were intended to be. Everything that keeps you from getting back is in your perception, and is deception. Deception is not power; it is a skill. The enemy has this skill. That is why he gains in people of the arts, in people with talent – rappers, singers, actors. He uses their talents for himself.

"When I hear the enemy say to me, 'Why do you pray? It's not going to matter.' I say, 'Then why don't you let me do it and fail? Then you'll get the glory. Just let me fail. It is because you lie.' You see, it is the perception. Until you perceive what he is trying to do with you, he has no control over you. When you believe the enemy, he becomes your god. There are many people in church moving in <u>a</u> god, thinking they serve the Almighty. The evil one will <u>let</u> you do all that **stuff**, but you are still in the wilderness.

"A captive is a person kept in confinement or restraint – dominated. Some have made Jesus an idol. He always pointed to the Father. What is he the way to? He is the way back to Genesis – the image of the Father. What Bible did Avraham use? There was no Torah. Avraham walked with God. We say, 'The Bible says.'

The Bible says nothing. It is the **written** word of God, the **written** word. It is **God** that says. God says more than what is written (see pg 6)

The delegation, consisting of Greg Brockman of the North Georgia Revival Outreach, Herman Parks of Christ Outreach Worship Center in Winder, Pastor Billy Angel of Kingdom Life Refuge in Commerce, Pastor Scott Lance of Revival Baptist Church, Pastor Bobby Ivester, and Rick Hempton of the Battlefield news, met Monday 30 June to draft a proposed amendment to the Jackson County Ordinance concerning "Religious Assemblies."

The proposed amendment to the county ordinance was delivered to the Jackson County Manager Kevin Poe on Monday 7 July as follows:

Religious Assemblies 351 d:

Religious services conducted on a site that is not permanently occupied by a religious assembly use, not to exceed a period of more than 15 days

If you are going to strike ordinance then we would like to add a clause that states:

(May need to say "Exclusion")

No religious assembly on private property shall require a permit provided there is ample privately provided parking and that the assembly does not violate pre-existing fire codes or noise ordinances

Also: In the "General Definitions" Section 1604 under the "Temporary Events" heading (6) the term "religious assembly" may need to be removed from the definitions.

Ask about fire codes and noise ordinances and are they different in different areas?

Also there should be no time limit especially our

A hearing for the proposed change to the county ordinance is proposed for sometime in August 2014.

"I like statistics," began Anthony (Tony) Bertsch, "56% of kids in this part of Georgia have already had sex, 42% suffer from depression, 42% take or have tried drugs, 41% drink or have drunk alcohol. We have a higher teen pregnancy rate than the rest of Georgia. In John 16:33 Jesus said, 'These things I have spoken to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.'

"These statistics have much to do with peer pressure. When you want to be like everybody else, you will compromise.

"In high school I knew the Lord, but I got into it with my dad and ran off and joined the Navy. People said I would change when I did that, but I said I wouldn't. But, in the Navy, there was peer pressure. This is the power the world has on us. I stopped going to church and got drunk on Sundays.

"One compromise leads to another, and another. I did not go back to church; I did not think I needed God, and in 2004, I got in trouble and spent 3 days in Jail. It took me a couple of years, but I was right back where I was before. The first compromise leads to the second, which leads to more, especially without God. He overcame the world, so I can too, but not without him.

"As I compromised, I went down darker and darker paths. I spent a week in jail. You find out who your friends are when you are in jail. It was just me and God. When I got out, my friends were nowhere to be found.

"The first compromise may not hurt, the second one either, but they will eventually. The world says, 'I'm your friend,' and you wanna be part of the crowd. That's why I drank alcohol. Jesus said, 'Be of good cheer; I have overcome the world.' He is a friend that sticks closer than a brother. Keep your eyes on Christ.

"This world will pass away and what we've saved up will be gone. Don't be a statistic. When you are in Christ, it doesn't matter what the world says. Don't worry about what your friends say. Keep doing what you're doing in Christ."

His life was celebrated on 28 June at 1100. The church was packed with standing room only. Nevertheless, as people left others came in to take their place. He was remembered by many. Our brother Lonnie was a former pastor, church elder, master musician, who helped many church bodies with music, he was a member of the board of directors of the Whole Body of Christ Alliance, a teacher, a speaker, a husband and father. I tell you these things so that you might know what things were important to Lonnie.

Nevertheless, and foremost, the primary purpose of this gathering was not to comfort the family, nor was it to celebrate Lonnie's life. It was for those of us who are among the living. It was, to cause us to reflect more seriously of our own inevitable end. Lonnie went home to be with the

Lord. One day I pray that you too will do the same. His destiny is written in stone. And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment: What judgment? Christians are not judged unto salvation at the "Great White Throne Judgment". They have already been judged righteous. That is why they are home with the Lord. Nevertheless, on the Day of Judgment, they will be judged as to what rewards they will receive.



Securing a place with the Lord is just the beginning of our journey. At the point of salvation we are accepted of the Lord. After that

comes the rest of our lives. What do we do now? Paul said it this way in 1 John 5:13. 1 John 5:13.

"These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God." The knowledge of you having eternal life doesn't come when you get to heaven. "For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for? But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it." Eternal Life comes now in this world. To be more precise, eternal life itself starts in this world, not in the sweet by and by, but rather in the rough here and now but that is another story for another day. I am trying to get to our reflecting more seriously on our own inevitable

Paul went on to say in 2 Corinthians 5:1-10:

- _1. For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.
- _2. For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven:
- _3. If so be that being clothed we shall not be found naked.
- _4. For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life.
- _5. Now he that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God, who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit.
- 6. Therefore we are always confident, knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord:
- _7. (For we walk by faith, not by sight:)
- _8. We are confident, I say, and willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be present with the Lord.
- 9. Wherefore we labour, that, whether present or absent, we may be accepted of him.
- 10. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad.

Paul went on to say in 1 Corinthians 3:8-15: 8. Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own

- reward according to his own labour.

 9. For we are labourers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building.
- 10. According to the grace of God which is given unto me, as a wise masterbuilder, I have laid the foundation, and another buildeth thereon. But let every man take heed how he buildeth thereupon.
- 11. For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.
- 12. Now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble;
- 13. Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is.
- 14. If any man's work shall abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward.
 15. If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss; but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire.

Paul was using a physical truth to illustrate a spiritual truth. In building a house, there must

not only be a good foundation, but there must also be good materials used to build on that foundation. In the spiritual realm, faith in Christ is our foundation. Once we are saved, we can either have works of the flesh (wood, hay, stubble) or works of the Spirit (gold, silver, precious stones).

We as Christians will one day stand before the Lord for the purpose of receiving rewards, and all our actions will be revealed, whether they were our own doings or directed by the Spirit of God. If they were spiritual (gold, silver, precious stones), we will be rewarded. If they were carnal (wood, hay, stubble), we will suffer loss. Notice that the fire will reveal what "sort" our works are, not what size they are. Matthew 10:42: And whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward. This verse shows that even our smallest acts of kindness will be rewarded. As revealed in 1 Corinthians 3:13, every person's work shall be tried to determine "what sort it is," not what size it is. Many people who have never done anything to gain the attention of the masses will shine bright in the day when the Lord passes out His rewards.

Some of the Lord's rewards for our actions come in this life, such as children, financial blessings, health, etc. However, some of our rewards will not be realized until we stand before God. This is the case with the reward for enduring persecution (Matthew 5:12 and Luke 6:23).

Hebrews 10:35 says, "Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompense of reward." Hebrews 10:35 says "For if I do this thing willingly, I have a reward: but if against my will, a dispensation of the gospel is committed unto me." As stated in Matthew 10:41; rewards can be shared by those who aid others in their righteous tasks. Again many of the rewards for ministering the Gospel will not come until we appear before the Lord (1 Corinthians 3:8-13, which speaks to, works will be tested by fire, and above 1 Corinthians 9:17, which speaks to, what was the motive behind the works.

Our good deeds that would normally be rewarded by our Father can be voided if we do them seeking the praise of people (Matthew 6:1-4). We can also receive a partial reward (2 John 8).

Those (ungodly) who are not in the kingdom of God will receive no rewards even though some of their actions might have been good (Proverbs 24:20). Rewards are only for those who have been cleansed from their evil deeds by the blood of the Lamb. Regardless of what these rewards shall be, there will not be any exalting of self over another. 1 Corinthians 4:7 says, "For who maketh thee to differ from another? And what hast thou that thou didst not receive? Now if thou didst receive it, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not received it?" The twenty-four elders in Revelation 4:10 are shown casting their crowns (which are rewards) down before the Lord and giving all their praise and worship their thim.

Most people today are preoccupied with quantity of ministry instead of quality of ministry. Yet Paul said that the Lord is going to reward us based on how well we did, not how much we did In keeping with Paul's illustration, some people will stand before the Lord with huge houses that will be reduced to rubble after God rejects the building materials they used (works of the flesh). Others who never gained acclaim here on earth because they never did any big, important works will be greatly rewarded because they faithfully fulfilled what the Lord called them to do (Luke 12:48).

In summary, the primary purpose of the funeral gathering was not for Lonnie nor was it to celebrate his victory, nor to console the family. Rather it was to cause us to reflect more seriously on our own inevitable end. How often do we watch funeral processions going through the streets or even take part in the funeral procession and carry the casket and then go home and fuss and fight with our brothers and sisters and even our spouses. Why are we Christians so easily offended? Why do we not realize that our unwillingness to suffer loss now will only result in our suffering the loss of our rewards in the world to come? By and by Lord when the morning comes, we'll tell the story of how we have overcome. Blessed be the name of the Lord.

Sin That Leads to Death

Once again I find myself in the position of having to say a great deal but not having been given sufficient space to say it. Therefore, it must be said over the course of more than one issue.

We have heard it said by many that all sins are the same – that one sin is not greater than another. **Not!** I am really not sure where that statement came from – that all sins are the same in the eyes of God – that one sin is not greater than another sin – because the Bible certainly

does not say that. In fact, the Bible shows otherwise. I know that a friend of mine, who does not like the idea of denominations, who says that denominations are the devil copying what God did at the Tower of Babel, would say that the statement is found in the 5th chapter of the book of Denominations. I believe, however, that it may possibly be due to a misunderstanding of scripture such as James 2:10 - "For whoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all." One sin, small or great, makes a man (or woman) a sinner and brings them under condemnation. This in no way, however, even suggests that all sins are the same with respect to severity.

Wherever the misconception comes is not as important as the fact that to teach that all sins are the same - that one is not greater than another - is to teach false doctrine. First John 5:16-17 speaks of sin that leads to death and sin that does not lead to death. The Great White Throne Judgment is to determine the extent of punishment. How could there be greater and lesser punishment if all sin is the same? Is it because some sin more often over a longer period of time than others? We all sin and, although we often talk as id it were by accident, almost none of it is. We all sin and, if we are not saved by the grace of God from it, we will suffer the eternal punishment that God prescribes for it. I will not belabor using scripture to show that there are sins that are greater than other sins. Use your brain and the word of God

I will say that there is one sin, one vice, of which no one in the world is free, which everyone hates when they see it in someone else, and which hardly anyone, except Christians, ever imagine that they are guilty of themselves.

I have heard people admit that they are bad tempered or impatient, that they cannot keep their heads regarding the opposite sex, or alcohol, or drugs, or even that they are cowards. I do not remember ever hearing anyone who was **not** a Christian accuse herself of **this** vice. And, at the same time, I have very seldom met **anyone** who was not a Christian show the slightest bit of mercy to it in others.

There is no fault that makes a person more unpopular, and no fault which we are more unconscious of in ourselves. And the more we have it ourselves, the more we dislike it inn others.

What is this sin that I am speaking of? What is this sin that is so great and yet we all wrestle with it? I will reveal it to you next month.

Understanding Faith (For a Change)

Not once, but twice in this issue have I been given a subject to deal with and about a quarter of the space I need to write it. So, you know the

I have heard so many people – Christians and non-Christians – use the word "Faith." It seems to mean different things to different people.

The New World Dictionary defines faith as: "An unquestioning belief that does not require proof or evidence," or "Unquestioning belief in God, religious tenets, etc." It is easy to see by the world's definition why the world doesn't want it

and why many Christians themselves misunderstand what it is. I will not attempt to deal with the subject of faith from a worldly perspective; the world is hopelessly confused about most things and faith is no exception. I Cor 14:33 tells us that God is not the author of confusion. So, I guess you know who is.

According to Christian teachers, faith seems to be used in two different senses - on two different levels: on a primary or simpler level and on a higher level - a level a little more difficult to understand. It is my intention to clarify what faith is on the primary level, not to deal with it, for now, on a higher level. It is faith on the primary level that we, as Christians, speak about the most. Unfortunately, it is faith on the primary level that many Christians seem to misunderstand. To help clear away some of that misunderstanding, lets take a look at what the Bible says about it, rather than what the world thinks about it, since it is, for the most part, what the world thinks about faith that has many Christians misunderstanding what faith actually is.

Heb 11:6 tells us that, "Without faith it is impossible to please God because whoever comes to God must believe that God is and that he is a rewarder of those who diligently seek him." Is this a complicated or difficult type of faith - to believe that God is real? It may be to some. It is not difficult for Christians, however, or they would not be Christians. This brings us back to the primary sense of the word. In the primary sense, faith is simply belief - accepting or regarding as true the doctrines of Christianity. We must be able to believe that God is real, but this alone is not enough to make us Christians. How many lost people have you heard say, "I believe in God," as if that really meant very much? A woman actually said to me, "I'm okay with God; its just that Jesus garbage I can do without." I shared with her how big it was of her to be okay with God. Believing in God is not, in itself, a virtue. James 2:19 says, "The demons believe there is one God and tremble." Heb 11:6 says that we also believe that, "He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek him." This refers to those who put significant effort into knowing him better on an on-going basis, not just believing he exists, as if existing were all he had to do. It is those people he rewards.

According to the worldly definition, faith is unquestioning belief that does not require evidence. But what does the word of God tell us that faith is? Heb 11:1 gives the definition, but unfortunately, of all the translations I have seen, only the King James and the New King James have translated it true to the original Greek. The others only cloud it and make it more confusing. Heb 11:1 says, "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.' This definition tells us not only what faith is but what faith is not. Faith is not believing without proof or evidence. Faith is not just believing in something so strongly that it becomes so. I give you a new concept: PING PONG balls. I'll explain next month.

A Fishy Smell in Jackson County

At the beginning of this edition of BFN victory was reported at the Jackson County Courthouse. Vice Chairman Dwain Smith told the people that showed up at the courthouse that the law would be changed. A delegation of concerned men from Jackson County and the whole body of Christ Alliance submitted a proposed amendment to the county ordinance to Kevin Poe, the County Manager (see pg 8 for exactly what was submitted). A draft of the new proposed county ordinance e-mailed to Greg Brockman at 17:45 (545pm) Friday 18 July, and not only were none of the things recommended by the delegation on the new proposal, but the new proposal is worse than the original ordinance 351d. To make matters worse, the BOC is scheduled to meet and vote on this new proposed ordinance at a quick meeting called on Thursday, 24 July at 1800 (6pm) at 67 Athens Street in Jefferson, the Administration Building. The new proposal was drafted by the Planning Commission, not the BOC, but if this new ordinance is passed, we will be worse off than before 16 January.

A high-ranking official in the Congregational Holiness Denomination has already begun to investigate recalling those on the BOC. The people of Jackson County are fuming, and rightfully so because it appears that the Planning Commission and the BOC planned this strategically to sneak by the people under cover of darkness as quickly and quietly as possible.

This may not be the case, but is indeed the way it appears.
