On Prayer 73 Intervention by Angels (Part Four)

In II Chron 18:18-21, we sit in on a council meeting in the very courts of heaven. Micaiah, a prophet of God, is talking to the king of Israel, and he describes a strategy session between the Lord and all the hosts of heaven:

"Therefore hear the word of the Lord: I saw the Lord sitting on his throne and all the host of heaven standing on his right hand and his left. And the Lord said, 'Who will persuade Ahav king of Israel to go up, that he may fall at Ramoth Gilead?' So one spoke in this manner and another spoke in that manner. The a spirit came forward and stood before the Lord, and said, 'I will persuade him.' The Lord said to him, 'In what way?' So he said, 'I will go out and be a lying spirit in the mouth of all his prophets.' And the Lord said, 'You shall persuade him and also prevail; go out and do it.'"

The Lord was talking over his plans with his angels – scriptural proof of angelic participation in the destiny of individuals and nations.

Do not miss the significance of this passage. God and the angels had a meeting that caused an entire nation to be defeated and another to be victorious. In this council meeting with the angels, heaven determined the outcome of these events **before the events occurred**.

To make this a little more personal, let's look at another important piece of scripture: "Take heed that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that in heaven their angels always see the face of my Father who is in heaven" (Mat 18:10).

This scripture says every child has a guardian angel. This means that angels are watching the normal, everyday happenings in our lives. As they do so, they see the face of God continually. I believe that guardian angels are assigned to protect us throughout our lives.

A principle of biblical interpretation is called the "principle of first mention." If you study the first mention of the atonement, the first mention of pride, or any other issue, you can get tremendous insight.

The first mention of angels in the Bible is to Hagar, Sarai's handmaid. Hagar had been thrown our into the desert.

"The angel of the Lord found Hagar near a spring in the desert......And he said, 'Hagar, servant of Sarai, where have you come from, and where are you going?

'I'm running away from my mistress Sarai,' she answered.

"The n the angel of the Lord told her, 'Go back to your mistress and submit to her'" (Gen 16-7-9).

Here we find an angel giving direction and guidance to a troubled outcast. To the natural mind, Hagar was a nobody, just a concubine pregnant with Ishmael. And yet, God sent her angelic help.

You would hardly expect the first mention of angels in the Bible to be in regard to Ishmael and Hagar. This passage teaches us that the Lord is concerned for the so-called "nobodies" and is interested in their welfare. An angel of God gave

direction and guidance to someone who was in trouble just like you and me.

In Gen 19, angels destroyed the city of S'dom (Sodom) after leading Lot and his daughters to safety. Angels were involved in providing something as simple as water in Gen 21;17-19. It was through an angel that Yitzchak (Isaac) was spared from being slain in Gen 22:10-18. Angels are involved in every aspect of life.

Angels provided Yitzchak a wife and Rebecca a husband (see Gen 24:7). Doesn't this inspire you to pray for angelic help for the arrangement of your children's marriages?

In Genesis 31, it was an angel that spoke to Ya'akov (Jacob) in a dream and told him to place poplar rods in front of breeding animals. Who would imagine that angels were involved in agricultural breeding practices? Yet Jacob prospered through their help.

Angels are excited about babies. In Genesis 18, angels were present when God told Abraham his wife would have a son. In Judges 13:3, an angel of the Lord appeared to the mother of Samson, a woman who was infertile, and told her she would bear a son. In I Sam 1:11, when Hannah prayed for a baby, she said, 'Oh Lord of Hosts.' She asked for angelic help.

Scripture is full of events describing angelic involvement. When Jacob was ready to die, he was in the process of blessing Manasseh and Ephraim (see Gen 48:16) and he said, "The angel who has delivered me from all harm – may he bless these boys."

Victory over sin comes from angelic help. Would you like to be "delivered from all harm"? (The KJV says "redeemed from all evil.) Jacob said the angel helped him.

Angels were instrumental in the defeat of Yericho (see Josh 5:13-6:2). Why did the walls of Yericho fall flat? It was because God's army was there. A seminary student once preached at our church, which is a church that believes the Bible. He said that the Hebrew soldiers marched in syncopation around Jericho and set up such a rhythm that the walls fell down. Our pastor spoke to him afterward and it was a long time before he preached there again.

The Bible says the commander of the army of the Lord (This may well be Yeshua our Lord) appeared to Joshua, and Yericho's walls fell flat by angelic intervention. Joshua asked him if he was for them or for their enemies. The commander answered, "Neither, I come as commander of **God's** army." Basically he was told, "I only line up with God."

An angel will never line up with man; man must line up with God. Pursue the Lord's purposes, and you can expect the army of God to back you up.

both feet. She began at a Bible University and, when the earthquake hit Haiti in 2010, she went there because she speaks French. She was in a church compound where a Voodoo temple could be seen less than a mile away. 'Has anyone gone over there to witness to those people?' She asked. 'No way!' was the answer.

No one would go there with her, so she went by herself. She told me the Voodoo priest was a pretty nice guy, but he told her, 'All of you Christians say something different. Why don't you get yourselves together, and then come back and talk to me?'

Folks, this is how the world looks at us.

John 17:20-21 says, 'I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in me through their word; that they all may be one, as you, Father, are in me, and I in you; that they also may be one in us, **that the world may believe that you sent me.**' People, how can the world possibly believe this when we are in 9000 different denominations, when a pastor from this denomination won't let anyone on the pulpit of that church unless they are in the same denomination?

The battle is already won (I John 5:4-5). One play the devil uses often, and one that I hear most often, is this: When something bad happens, who is the first to receive the blame? There are times and seasons in life we will get kicked in the gut and life will try to pull the joy out of us. Every one of us will go through those seasons. Hopefully, none of us will go through a more difficult time than Job. Remember Job? He's the person in the Bible that lost his possessions, his children, and his health. His friends gave him a lot of bad advice about his situation. They didn't empathize with him and told him all his problems were his fault. But one of his friends told him that God "will "yet fill your mouth with laughter and your lips with shouts of joy" (Job 8:21).

Those words may not have been very comforting when he was suffering and grieving, but at least they were hopeful. But I doubt Job could see his way through his pain to that day when laughter would return. How can a joyful heart be good medicine if you don't feel like having a joyful heart? You can't make someone joyful, can you? Look, it is true that we cannot always change our circumstances, but there are times that we can

change our perspective. Finish this sentence for me: "When life gives you lemons..." That's right, when life gives you lemons, make lemonade. This statement carries within it what we might call a comedic perspective on life. Have you ever visited someone that was going through a difficult time, and while you were with that person, you laughed, you cried, you listened to their stories, and when you left, it occurred to you that you were the one lifted un?

That person's perspective affected you in a way you did not expect. While things might not have been good, that person was still joyful. The Spirit of God was still evident in that person's life. Their spirit of joy was contagious.

Developing a comedic perspective on life is possible when the Spirit of Jesus lives within us. By this, I do not mean that everything is funny. What I mean is that even in the worst of times, we can have a faith that says, "This is not the final story. This situation, though it's not good, will not dictate my attitude."

After Paul became a disciple of Jesus, his life was not easy. He was imprisoned, beaten, stoned, shipwrecked, in danger from countrymen, Gentiles, and Jews that pretended to care for him but they really wanted to hurt him. He was often hungry, thirsty, cold, in need of clothes, and there were churches he had established that pressured him for many things.

Paul wrote to the church at Corinth that only a fool would make these situations something to boast about. He said he **was** a fool, a fool for Christ.

A comedic perspective does not depend on everything to turn out right. Instead, this person does depend on the One who enables us to celebrate life even when everything is not coming up roses.

Trust me; in this life, everything will not turn up roses. Even when they do, to get to the rose, you

have to avoid the thorns. What did Paul have to base his comedic perspective on? It was the empty tomb. Paul knew that the greatest joke ever pulled was the one God pulled with the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The reason we can have a joyful heart is that we have read the end of the story and it's a celebration. The evil one wants us to get stuck reading the middle of the story and forget how the story ends. It's the beginning of a New Year, and Snoopy is dancing all around Lucy. He's happy. He has a smile on his face.

"How can you be happy when you don't know what this year has in store for you? Don't you worry about all the things that can happen?" Lucy asks, trying to rain on Snoopy's parade. Snoopy becomes subdued. He whimpers. He begins to walk away with an attitude of dread, much to the approval of Lucy.

"That's better. Live in dread and fear. Be sensible," she says.

Such is the nature of the person who has a comedic perspective on life. When the Holy Spirit comes into our lives, this comedic perspective should grow and develop. People around us just think we are foolish.

For centuries, Jesus was portrayed as a humorless person and was rarely painted or drawn laughing or smiling until modern artists began doing so several decades ago. Even though Jesus lived with a comedic perspective and incorporated humor into his stories, artists kept him subdued, expressionless, as if there was no joy on his face or in his life. Jesus drew verbal cartoons by referring to the Pharisees as blind guides and poked fun at the traditions they made up while they ignoring the more important laws of God. To illustrate this, Jesus said, "You strain out a gnat, but swallow a camel" (Mat 23:24).

He illustrated their hypocrisy by saying of them in their religious rituals, "You clean the outside of the cup or dish, but inside they are full of greed and self-indulgence." In saying this, he bespoke the way they lived their lives, always wanting to look good on the outside while living with dirty hearts. While others could see the humor in what Jesus was saying about the Pharisees, they themselves did not seem able to see it. This is one of the reasons that having a sense of humor is a sign of

good health, especially if we can learn to laugh at ourselves. We all know that we are not perfect. But so often, we fail to see ourselves as others see us, imperfect human beings capable of good things, but also people who sometimes miss the mark. We don't like it when people hold up a mirror and show us ourselves when it's not all that flattering. We can become angry, live in denial, and strike back, or we can react in a different way.

accord and in one place. And suddenly - that means without warning - God shows up and things change in your life. It's like if somebody brought a package to your house and it was good. That's the way God does when you least expect it - a 'suddenly.' There is a 'suddenly' coming for you. As long as you hold him while he is holding you, he will move. It will be a 'suddenly' like it says in II Chron 7:14.

"Suddenly! God says, 'I have not forgotten the labor of love you did for me.' God has some books

up there with the prayers and the tears of the righteous. God says, 'I know when you pray and pray and pray.' You have a 'suddenly' coming. A suddenly comes when you are almost ready to give up.

"In Acts 3:2 the man was crippled from birth, but we fuss because we've been going through

something for two or three years. Some people are hurting worse than you. No matter what's going on, as long as our anchor is Jesus, there's gonna be a 'suddenly.'

"This lame man was not begging in front of Walmart, but in front of church. He listened expecting some money. What you expect you may not get. You will get what you need. God is holding something back for you. When Daniel first prayed, God heard him, but there was a battle going on. There is always a battle going on when you're praying because the devil wants you to think that God does not hear. God dispatched an angel for Daniel and will dispatch an angel for you. When the package comes, it's gonna be a 'suddenly.'

"Peter said, 'Silver and Gold have I none, but...' It was the same when the woman with the issue of blood touched Jesus – he felt power go out of him. It was the same when Peter told this lame man to get up and walk. The man <u>ran</u> and praised God. When God gives you something, the devil will try to take it away. God is the same yesterday, today and forever. If he did it one time, he'll do it again. I am waiting on my 'suddenly.'

"When God works a miracle in you, you are not gonna keep quiet; you're gonna tell somebody about it. Buddha's not going to get the praise, Mohammed won't get it; Allah won't get it. Jesus is gonna get the praise.

"Has your **suddenly** come yet? Tune out the negative stuff – what you feel and hear, the five senses, which only tell you that you are hurting.

"God, instill the message in me to tell people there is a **suddenly** coming. Nobody's gonna get the credit, but God. You don't know where it is coming from; you might be in the grocery store. I'm getting closer to my **suddenly**. I am right at the tip of it. How do I know? Because the devil is trying everything he can. I'm almost at my **suddenly**. How do we get there? We confess it. We speak it. We talk about it. We don't need to vocalize that we are not feeling good.

"Mark 11:22, you have no money because you say it. It says in 3 John 2, ...that you prosper, be in good health even as your soul prospers. He said if you are obedient in your tithes and offerings, he will open up the flood gates of heaven. You will receive based on what you give. I've got a 'suddenly' coming. Speak it. It's on the way, and when it comes, it will be out of nowhere.

"People try to predict the weather, but you cannot predict what God is gonna do (unless he tells you). God will come 'suddenly.' There is a 'suddenly' on the way for you – a healing, a recovery. There is a 'suddenly on the way for me. I dated a woman for three years and it didn't work out. Then I dated another woman and we found out we were cousins. There is a 'suddenly on the way. Get your mind on Jesus."

Because of your growth people try to make you become stagnate so they can control you. People will press your buttons. Say, 'Thank you' to test your growth and your prayer.

Whether by the creator's design or by forces beyond our comprehension, in each generation there comes a few titans, prodigies and champions -

individuals that emit so much strength, so much raw magnetic appeal and energy that it affects everyone and everything around them. Once again this phenomenon has occurred. Once again the bar of excellence has been raised. This time I speak of the two ladies that formed the duo called Immeasurable.

Immeasurable Cares is a non-profit 501(c) federally tax exempt, faith based ministry of local volunteers who work hand-in-hand with churches, faith based groups, charitable organizations, social service agencies and individuals to respond to the homelessness crisis in the United States.

The testimony of these two anointed ladies that God is using both by their voices and their other gifts is bringing awareness to a major issue that we have here in America, which is homelessness. Esther grew up in a land under religious and cultural persecution, yet she obeyed the laws of the land. She was chosen as the queen of Persia, a job that came with the fear of death at the hand of a fickle king, and loss of her personal freedoms, not to mention her virginity and all this to become one of many women for the king. She fought an evil one, who sought to kill, steal, and destroy. If Esther had failed to rise to meet any of the challenges before her, we would not have a holiday, nor a lineage for our Messiah.

"Indeed, her Hebrew name, Hadassa, meant myrtle branch, which was a laurel placed on the heads of those who were victorious in battle. We too bear the mark of victory when we remember that God is moving behind the scenes to develop us. Remember, when you cannot see his hand, trust his heart.

"How did Esther's ancestors make the way for her? Is 51:1-2, 'Listen to me, you who follow after righteousness, you who seek the Lord: Look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the hole of the pit from which you were dug.' We need to look to our roots to get perspective on our lives. There are three ways that her ancestors made the way:

- 1: She was a descendant of Sarah.
- 2: She was the daughter of Abihail (Avichail)
- 3: She was from the tribe of Benjamin

"How are Esther and Sarah linked? They are linked in several ways. Sarah was 127-years-old when she died. In the beginning of the book of Esther, it says King Ahasuerus reigned over 127 provinces. In the Bible numbers are really important. In Hebrew, the letters are numbers. Therefore, the numbers are as important as the words in their meaning. Esther came along 13 or 1400 years after Sarah, who is the only woman in the Bible whose name was changed by God, had her age or her death recorded. The 127 is not extraneous information; it is there for a reason.

"Sarai means 'My Princess.' God changed her name to 'Princess.' He dropped the 'i.' Why? It was because she was always someone's princess her father, Avraham, and many kings sought after her to make her their princess. But the thing that was going to happen with Isaac was so much greater than her royal nature. It was not based on relationship to man, but on the spiritual lineage that she would birth. God wanted that not only would Isaac be the son of Avraham, but also of Sara (princess) because Avraham also had a son with Hagar. Ishmael was the son of the slave. Linking Esther and Sarah is for similar purpose. Esther became queen, giving them both that royal nature. It was purely God because Esther had no reason to be royal; she was an orphan - a nobody.

"Esther was the daughter of Avichail (Est 12:15). How does this matter at all? I mean the guy is dead. He has no bearing on the story. Right? Esther reigned from about 486 to about 465 BC, about 100 years after the destruction of the first temple – about two generations after its destruction. It matters because the book of Esther is going out of the way to note what her birth father's name is – twice. His name was Avichail (Avi = father, chail or khail = valiant), meaning my father is valiant. It could mean that her father was valiant, but probably meant that her grand father was valiant.

Realize that her family was still living in Persia even though many Jews had returned to Jerusalem and built the second temple.

"Eshet Chayil means 'woman of valor.' This is what the ideal woman in Ps 31 is called – eshat Chayil. It is traditional on Friday nights for Jewish husbands to recite Prov 31 over his wife as a blessing and a prophecy. The word 'chayil' (valor) has the connotation of warfare.

"Now her grandfather being a warrior – remember the name Hadassa means laurel of myrtle for victory in battle – we see that her lineage is one of a family who fights. So whether it is about her father, her grand father or her Father in heaven, the author wants us to know that God is strong and valiant.

"Esther was from the tribe of Benjamin. Remember that God allotted areas to the 12 tribes. Benjamin's allotment was tiny. Basically, it was the area around Jerusalem and the temple. It was the job of Esther's family was to protect the tabernacle. Benjamin means 'son of my right hand.' In warfare terminology, the right hand is the stronger. When Ya'akov (Jacob) was on his death bed in Egypt and he was giving blessings to his sons, he said, 'Benjamin is a ravenous wolf, in the morning devouring the prey and in the evening dividing the spoil.' It meant that Benjamin was an opportunist; he made the best out of a bad circumstance.

"Now Haman's heritage goes all the way back to Amalek, who when the Israelites were leaving Egypt, attacked them from behind. The crime of this is that Amalek did not come against them faceto-face: but from behind like cowardly Jackals. who attack the children, old people and the weak in the rear of the formation. They were not honorable warriors, but disgusting people, who attacked the weak. That spirit went down some generations to Agag, who was the king of that same disgusting people. Because King Sh'aul (Saul) did not utterly destroy them and all their animals, as the Lord ordered, but allowed King Agag to live, Haman is alive to vex the children of God in the book of Esther. The Bible makes it a point to say that Haman is a descendant of Agag and show that the reason that Haman is there is because Saul did not do what he was supposed to do in eradicating this disgusting people. Esther fulfills this wolf nature when she took down the descendants of Agag.

"Ze'ev means wolf. Hebrew is a very graphic language. Each thing has a picture to go along with it. So when we are shown this wolf image is a weapon who can attack the bull (the strength) and the tent – in others words, someone who severs the strength of the house. So now Esther goes up against Haman of the Amalekites. She is fulfilling the prophecy of who the Benjamites would be. He will devour the prey in the morning and at night share the spoils with his brothers. So she made the best of the situation and shared credit with others, mainly with Mordecai. Later Esther and Mordecai would mandate the giving of gifts on Purim to celebrate that victory.

"So, God has laid the foundation for us. He knows our needs. God put all the pieces together to make what is gonna happen. He has also hand picked for us our ancestors, our family origins, our parents and our ethnic background. He has chosen for all of us. God is using those things in our lives to open doors. Sometimes we are not conscious of those things that God has planned from the foundation of the earth, your personal legacy, heritage and beauty.

"We often think about our lives like we live them in a vacuum, but the Lord says, 'I will visit your iniquity on the 3rd and 4th generations. Therefore, what is happening now will still be seen in the third ad fourth generations. It matters. What is your legacy? What does God want you to project into the generations to come?"

Cure for the Common Heart

Often there are articles from past issues that are worth reprinting. Here is one from $3\frac{1}{2}$ years ago.

Early one morning before spring of this year, I was awakened by an intense presence of the Lord. I got out of bed to go pray, but then I was overwhelmed by his spirit. I don't know how long I stood at the foot of the bed in the dark, tears streaming as the Lord poured out his Spirit.

Eventually my wife, Crystal woke and asked, "What are you doing?"

"I don't know," I answered, "but I am being filled with the Holy Ghost."

Not wanting to keep her awake and needing private time with the Lord, I made my way to the living room. There I stood weeping as the presence of the Lord overflowed. At that point he began to speak to my heart. He, very uncharacteristically reminded me of a sin I had committed 14 years ago. It was something I had done just out of the blue. I was living for the Lord, but just did something I had no business doing.

I was standing there hearing the Lord as plainly as I have ever heard him. He said, "I have

forgiven you for that, and now you need to forgive yourself." In my mind I began to wonder how important it really was to forgive myself. I mean, didn't I know better? Didn't I deserve to hold myself in contempt for such behavior? Then I heard the voice of the Lord again as he spoke in a way that shook me to the core of my being. He said, "When you know that I have forgiven you and you refuse to forgive yourself, it is because you esteem your opinion higher than mine."

I fell to my knees as I realized the pride that was in my heart. "How could I esteem my opinion so highly?" I answered him, "of course, Lord, I forgive myself. And thank you for setting me free from that bondage."

Ez 14:3 says, "Son of man, these men have set up their idols in their hearts, and placed before them that which causes them to stumble into iniquity."

On that day, the Lord revealed to me an idol I had placed in my heart, and the idol was my own opinion. How many are bound up by their own Unforgiveness? How many refuse to forgive someone else knowing that the Lord has forgiven them? How many of us hold ourselves hostage, holding our selves to a higher standard out of pride, and refuse forgiveness for our own actions?

I believe today in our nation, the number one idol is opinion. It is opinion that is based not on God's word, but on the imaginations of men's hearts. It is based on ideas and thoughts that flow from a corrupt heart full of pride. We reason with ourselves and determine through our own experiences and those of others what is right and what is wrong. But it is the word of God that will prevail. No opinion is higher than his. No thought that we have as individuals or as a nation will cast a shadow on his thoughts. No opinion that we hold dear, that we admire, or that we disdain will hinder his plan or thwart his purpose.

To turn to God with our whole heart means that we forsake our pride, that we turn our opinions over to him, that we represent his opinion, and that we die to our own. The words, "well, I believe such and such," must give way to the word, "This is what the word of God says," and may it be so from this day on in my heart and in yours.

So be it.

Please keep praying for baby Alderley. We shared his story last month. He needs special medical attention, which includes a nurse that will care for him 24/7, a colostomy bag, a catheter and medicine. Unfortunately, we cannot send the material to Brazil because of the bureaucracy and risk of the material not arriving on time. But, if this is something you would like to help with, you can make a donation on our website (link is in the main picture on the top).

The children enjoyed a special day: the girls got together and learned how to bake a cake and ice it, and the boys learned how to wash a car and the basic principles of changing a tire. This helps them work together as a team, and it also teaches them several lessons that they will carry when they've grown.

Last, but not least, pray for the administration staff. The authorities in Iranduba are demanding that another room be built at the Father's Heart shelter because they have twelve beds in one room, whereas they're supposed to have only six beds per room. That will be an extra expense on the top of the many they already have. We praise God because we serve Him, and we are certain that all things are possible! Thank you for your support.

The Hedgehog

I Thessalonians 5:23

"May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole <u>spirit</u>, <u>soul</u> and <u>body</u> (emphasis added) be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."

An old school way of looking at mankind's makeup is to merely refer to a person as a "soul." While I can certainly understand that, the theological opinion I've long since landed on is that we have three distinct parts to our being: our body (physical presence), our soul (unique personality) and our spirit (made in the image of God—distinct in all of creation). The passage above is one which supports this position. All three of these components, if you will, of our makeup are what make us uniquely sons and daughters of God through Jesus Christ. All of that makes sense, right?

Enter, the Hedgehog:

In Job 1:10, we see Satan speaking to God about Job. Here is a key part of what he says: "... Have you not put a hedge around him and his household and everything he has?" Many sermons and prayers have centered around this "hedge of protection" God has around all of us. I actually pray about this all of the time. All is well when our hedge is strong and we're protected. But life on the current earth has more to it than that. There's a much more sinister element lurking around our lives.

In a way, I think of Satan and his demonic followers as a type of "hedgehog." They wander around our hedge of protection and do everything they can to throw us out of balance. Unfortunately, when we're out of balance, we often turn to sin as a remedy. That's actually the goal of the demonic hedgehogs—to discourage us and turn us towards sin. If they can knock us out of balance, they win. Only the Lord can keep us in balance between our body, soul, and spirit.

It seems to me that most of the attacks from the evil realm are covert. The enemy largely operates outside the limelight so as to not have their treachery exposed to the light of God's truth. So they bury themselves around our hedge, constantly launching spiritual attacks in the hopes we'll turn to ourselves or the world for the remedy, not God. So what is God's best prescription for thwarting the hedgehogs? Consider this:

Hebrews 4:12, "For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart."

Spiritual wars must be fought with spiritual weapons. Or rather, wea-pon (singular). The word of God is certainly powerful as an offensive weapon, but it also provides an incredibly soothing defensive medicine for our spirit and soul through the blessed gift of hope.

Hope is the one thing we absolutely cannot live without. Biblical hope transcends physical death and gives us a glimmer of light in our momentary troubles through the one who spilled his blood for our sins, Jesus Christ. I've written a unique book on hope titled, "Late Night Breakfast * a vision of hope." It's about a truck driver who feels like he's lost everything, only to discover how biblical hope can bridge the gap between our momentary troubles and an eternal life of joy with Jesus Christ.
